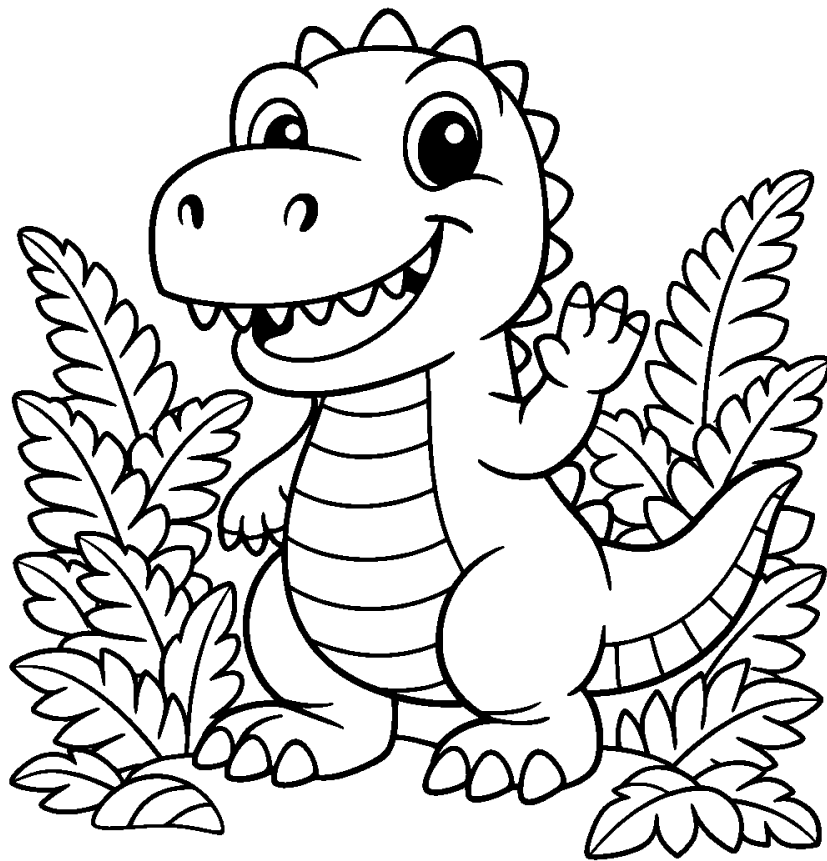

Stomp into our free dinosaur coloring pages. Original printable designs starring friendly long-necks, smiling spotted dinos and a busy prehistoric valley with palm trees and a volcano. Every page downloads instantly as a high-quality PDF sized for Letter and A4 paper, with no sign-up and no watermarks, and each one can also be colored online in the browser. The outlines are bold and roomy, ideal for dino fans from about age three and up. And here is the best part for young paleontologists: nobody actually knows what color dinosaurs were, so a pink brontosaurus with turquoise spots is just as scientifically valid as a green one. Print a few for a dinosaur party, a rainy Saturday or the classroom science corner.

Tips for coloring dinosaurs

Greens and browns are the classic choice, but real dinosaur colors are a genuine scientific mystery. Which makes this the one subject where kids can go wild with confidence. Try stripes or spots on the big body areas, a different color for the belly, and warm yellows or oranges for the background sky. The spots and back plates in these designs are drawn extra large so even small hands can stay inside the lines.

Turn coloring time into dino talk

These pages are an easy springboard for questions little experts love: What did a long-neck eat? Why did some dinosaurs have plates on their backs? Could a volcano really erupt nearby? Coloring keeps hands busy while the conversation wanders. Teachers tell us it is the calmest ten minutes of the week.

Frequently asked questions

What age are these dinosaur pages for?

Roughly three and up. The friendly long-neck is the simplest; the prehistoric valley scene has the most detail for older kids.

Are the PDFs really free?

Can I color the dinosaurs online?

Yes. Every dinosaur has a "Color online" button, so you can color them online in our browser studio, perfect for tablets.

How to print

Every page is sized for US Letter and prints on A4 without cropping if you set your printer to "fit to page". Print single-sided so colors do not show through, and use cardstock if you plan to use markers. There are no watermarks and no sign-up, on any page.

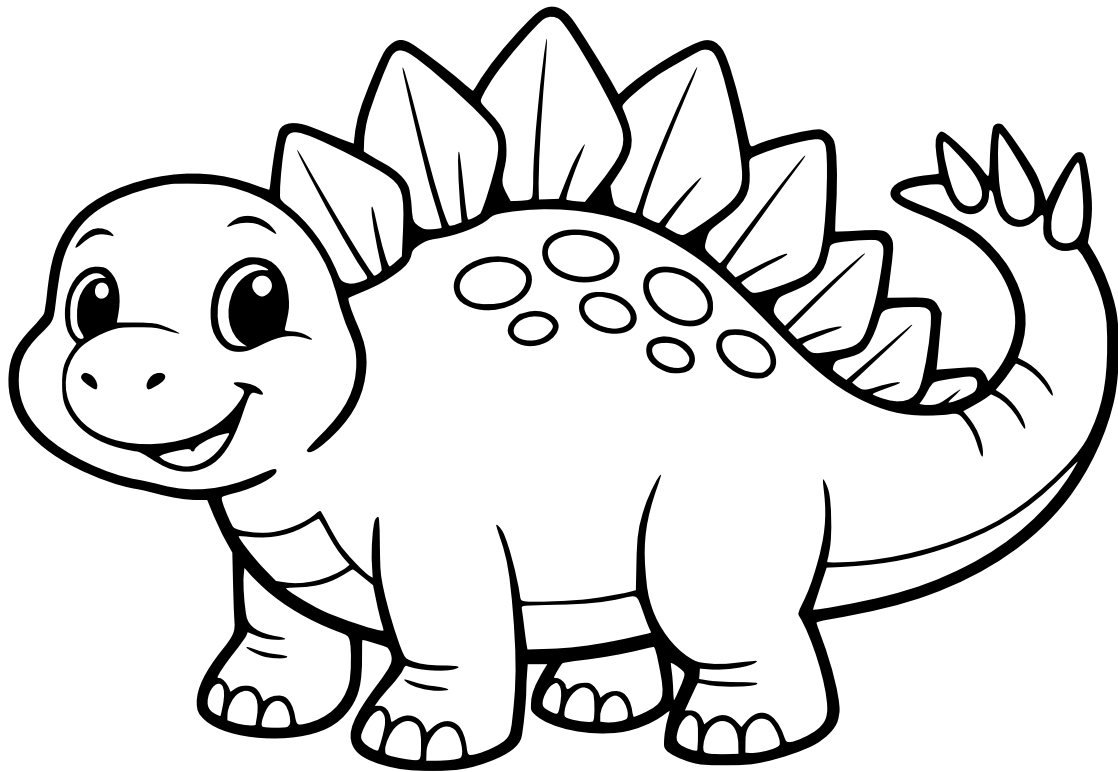
1. Friendly T-Rex Says Hi	6	14. Armored Ankylosaurus	19

A long diplodocus lowers its head to sip from a calm lake, its whip-like tail curving along the shore behind reeds.			

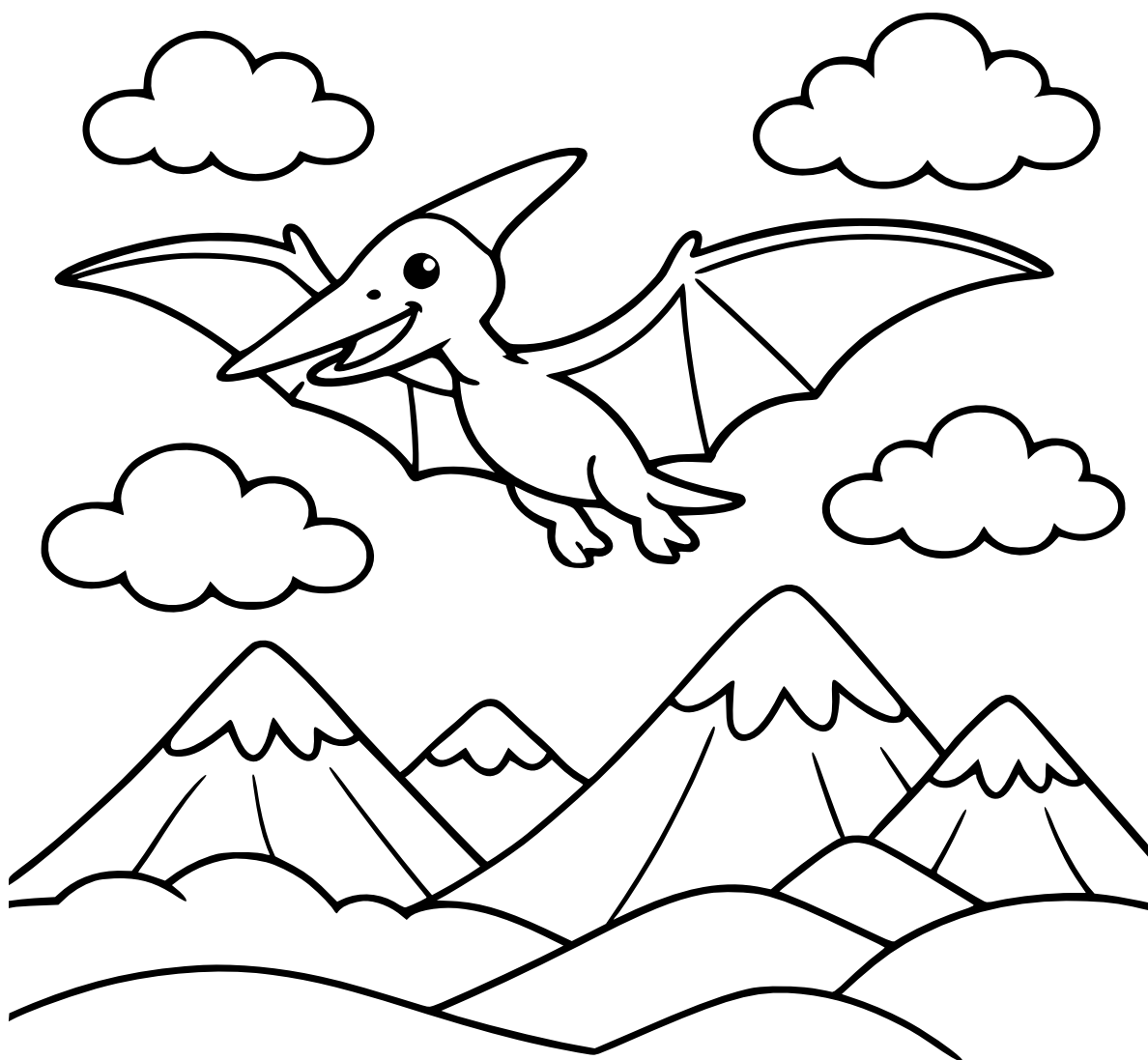
26. Charging Triceratops	31	38. Jungle Walk	43

Two friendly dinosaurs stand side by side smiling at each other, one tall and long-necked, the other small and spiky.			



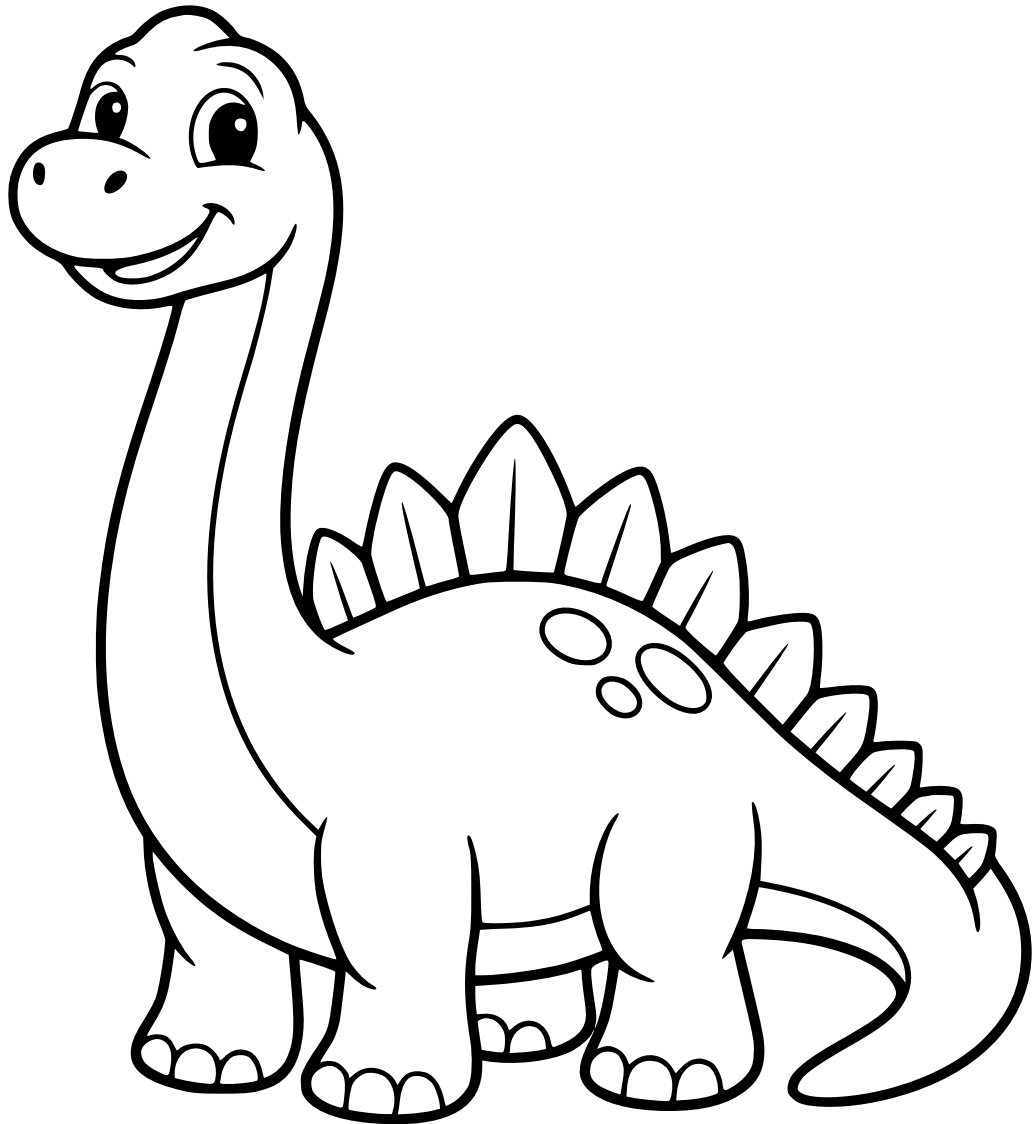


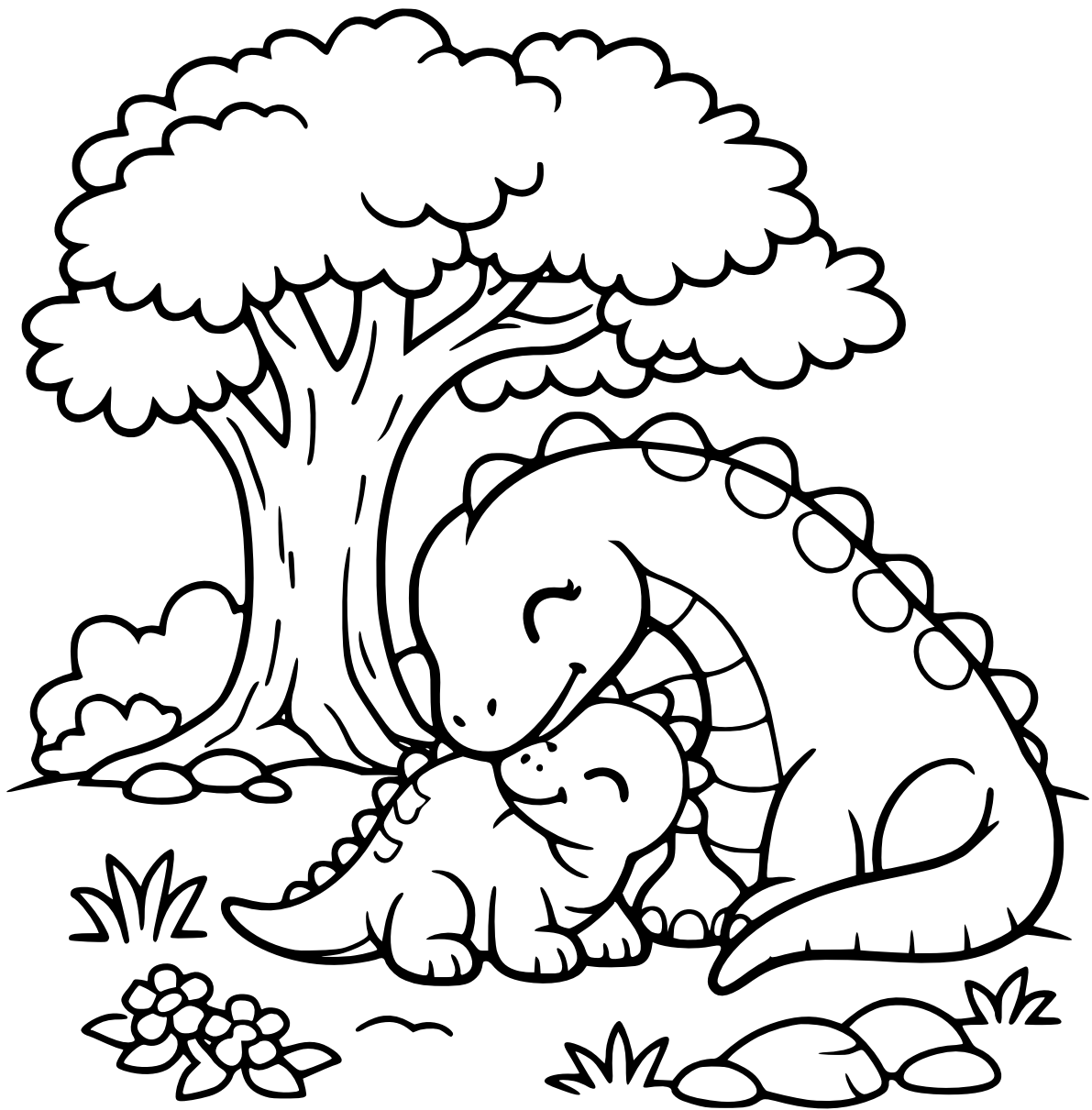


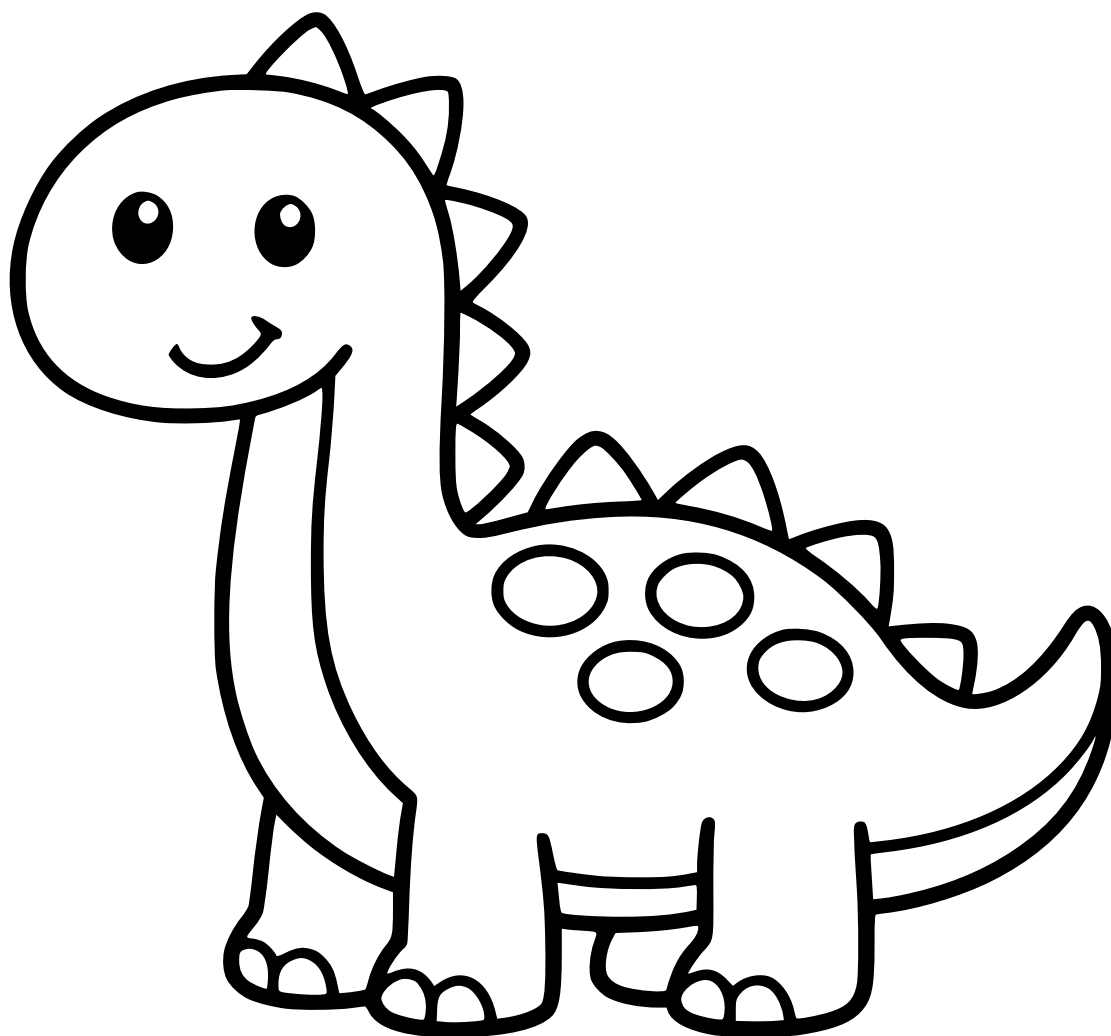


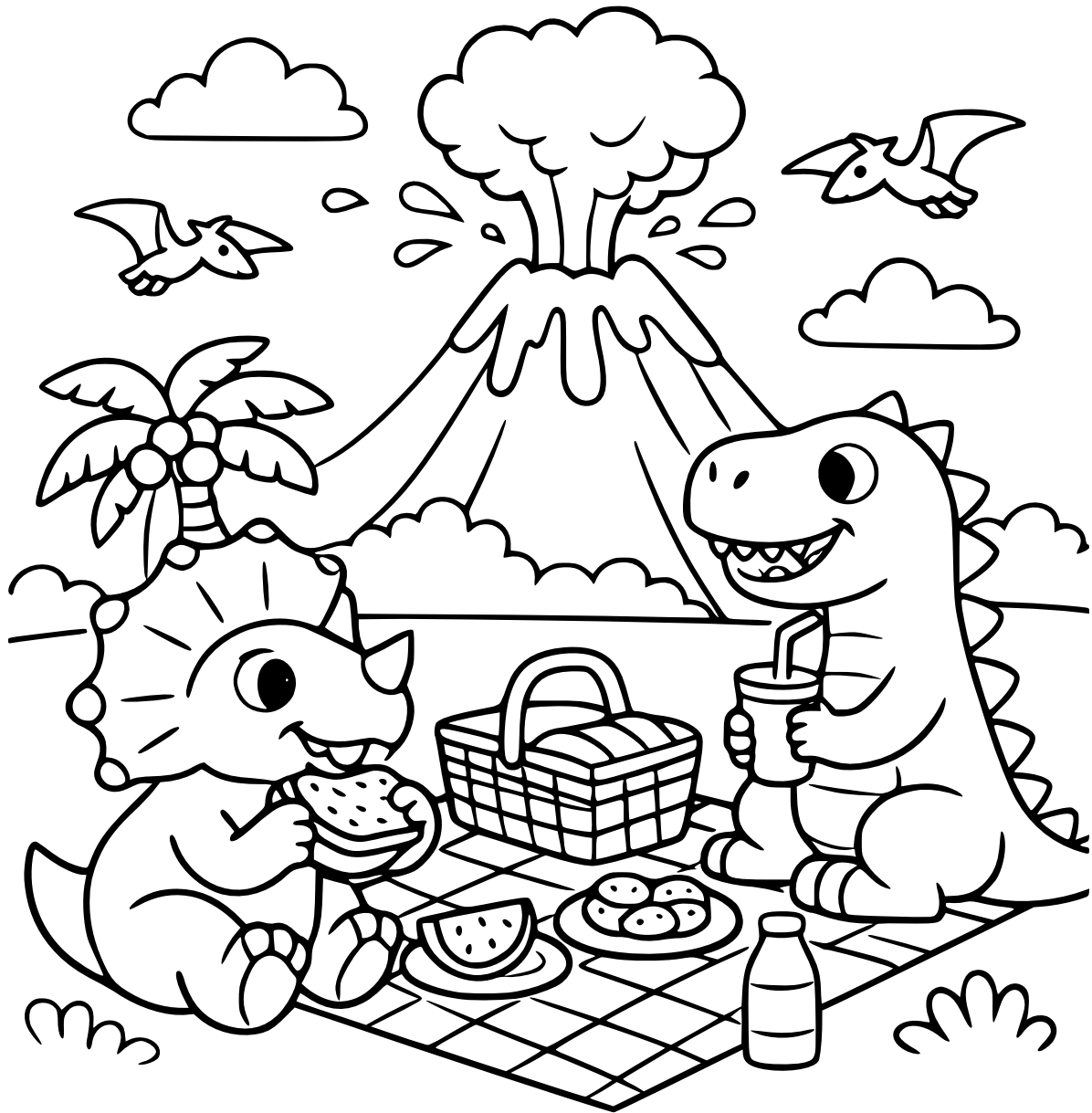


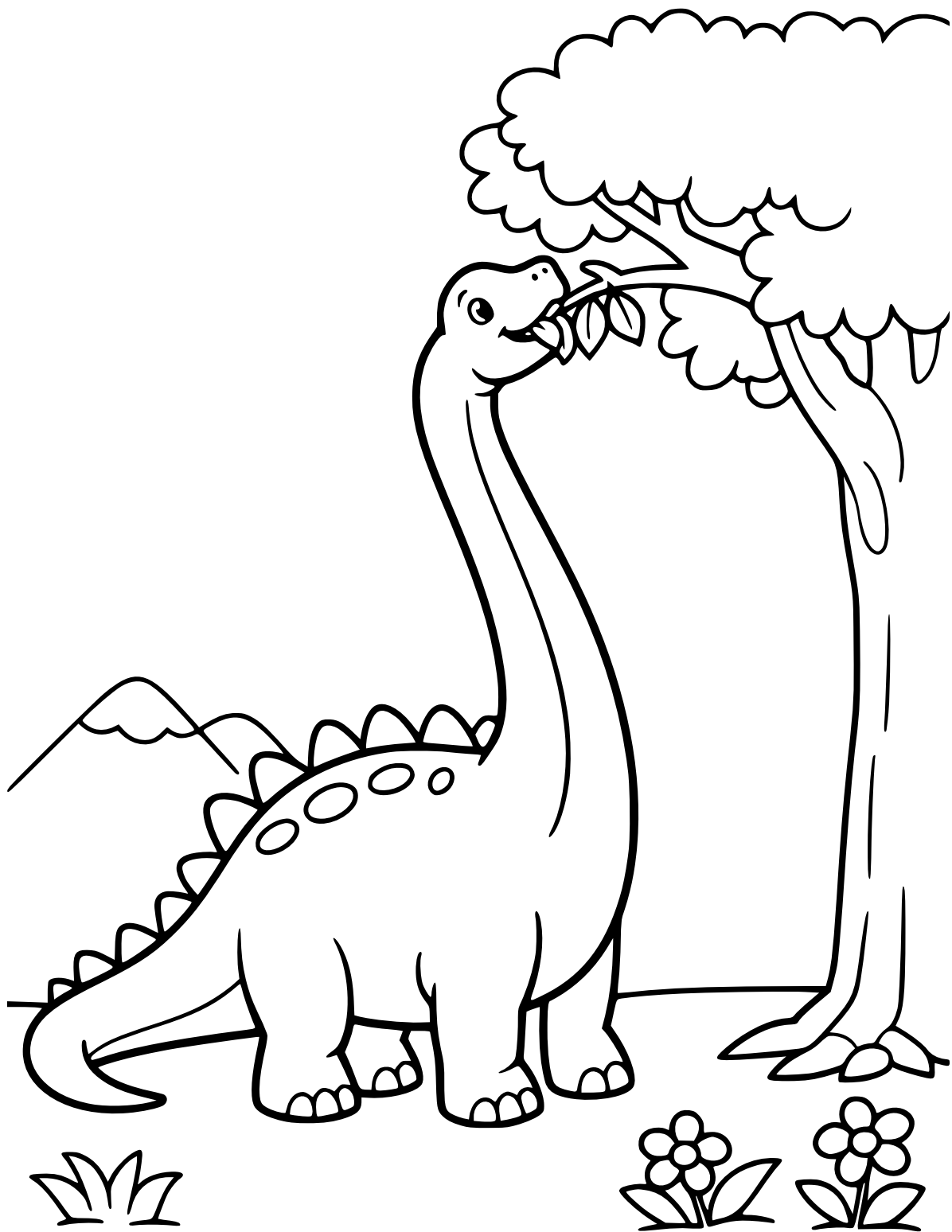


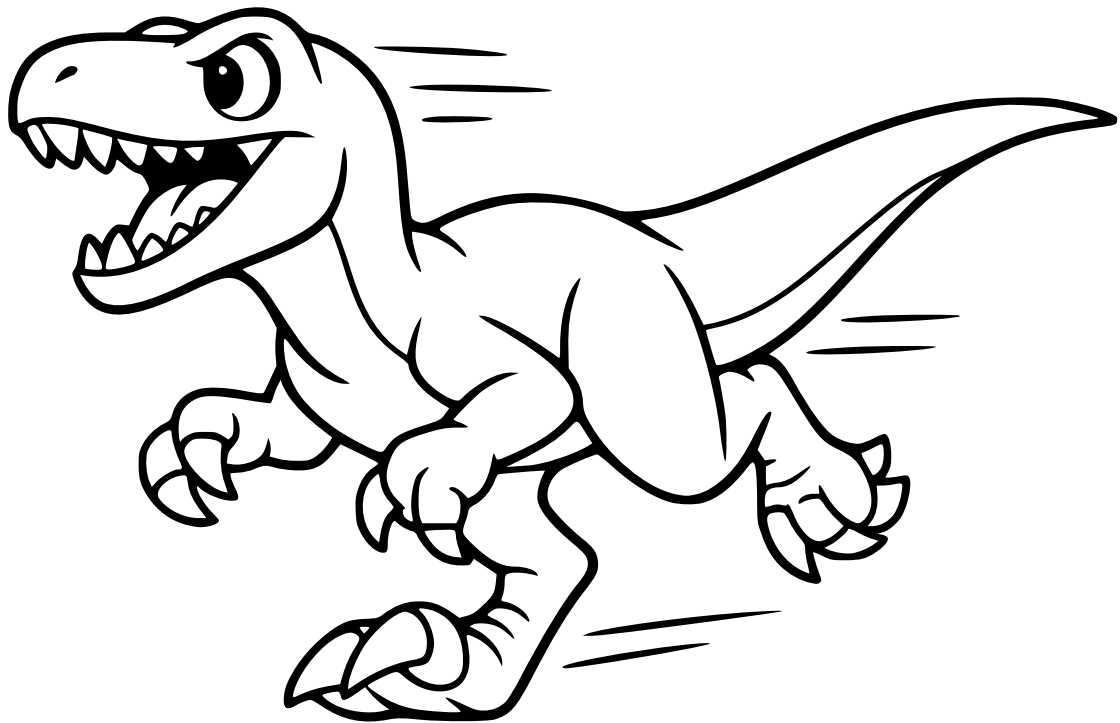


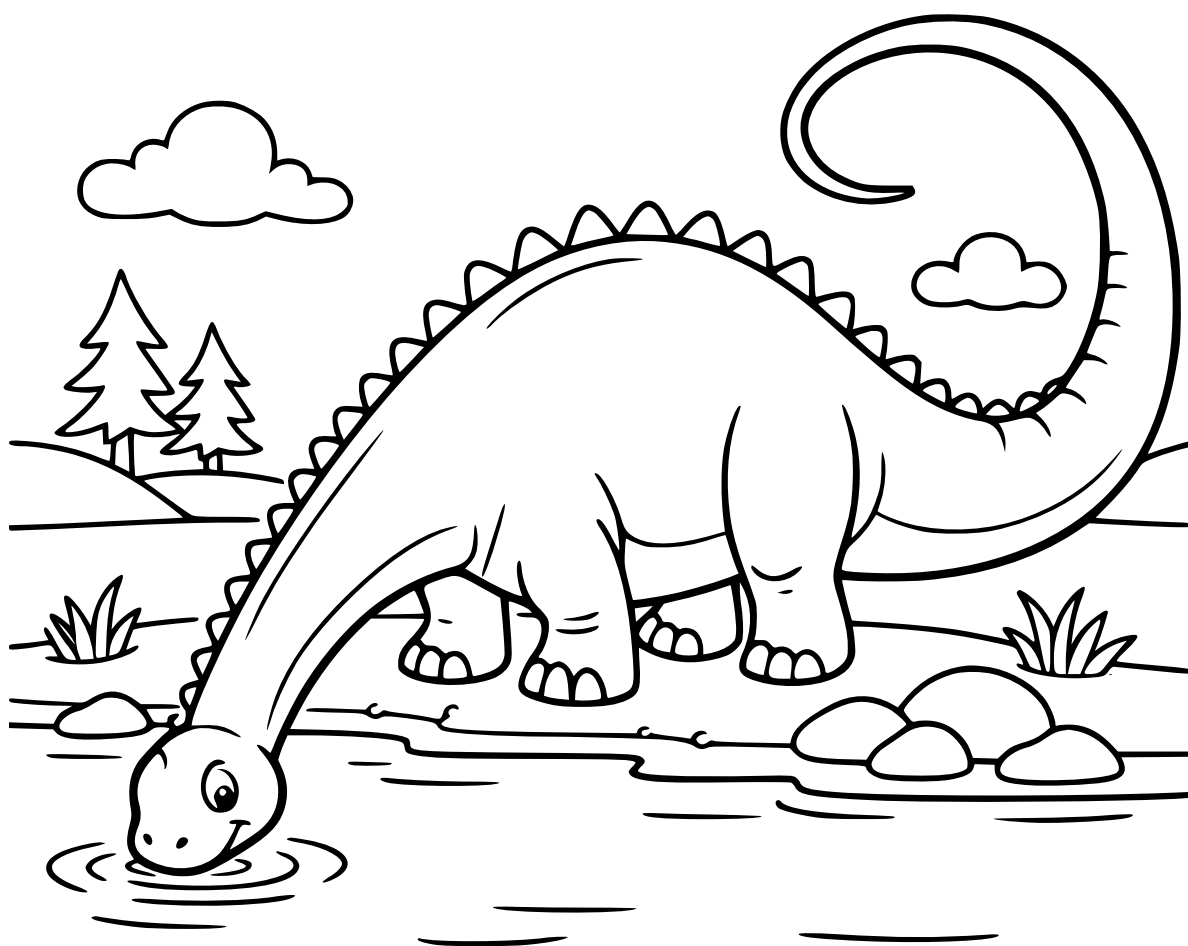


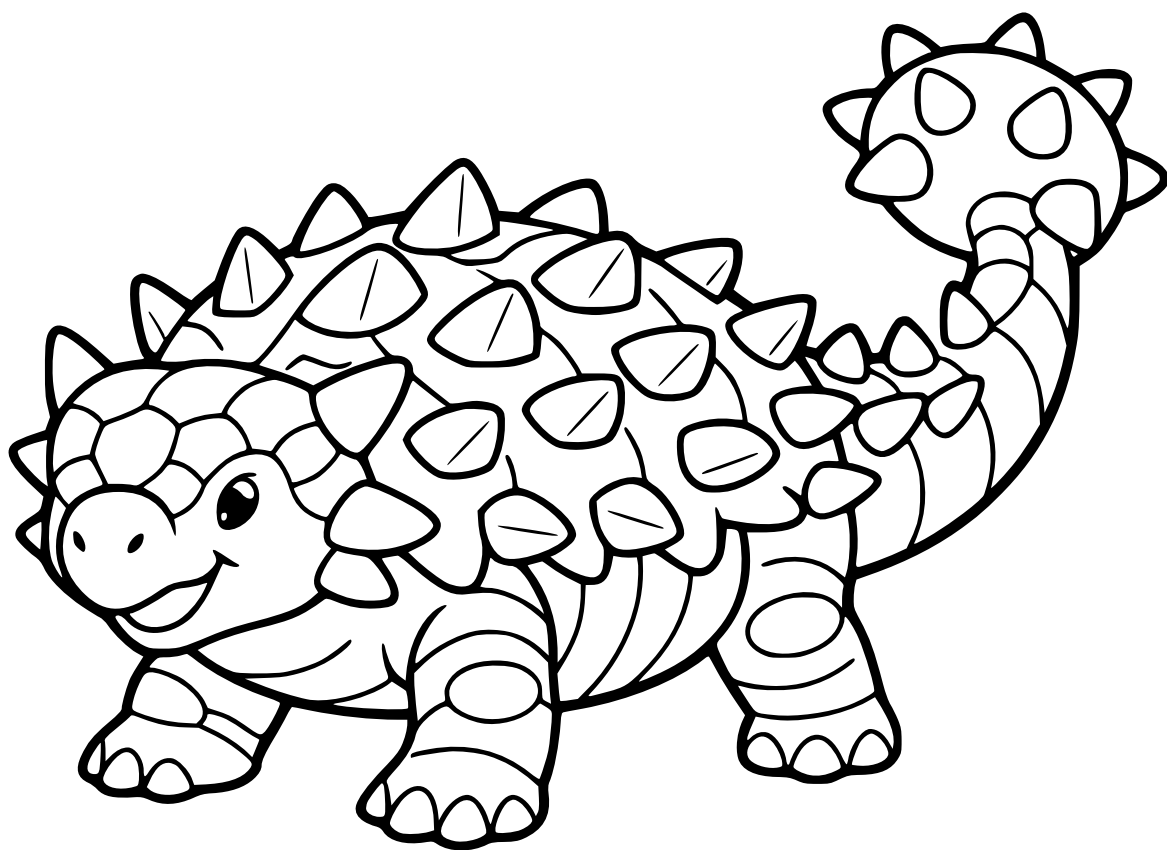


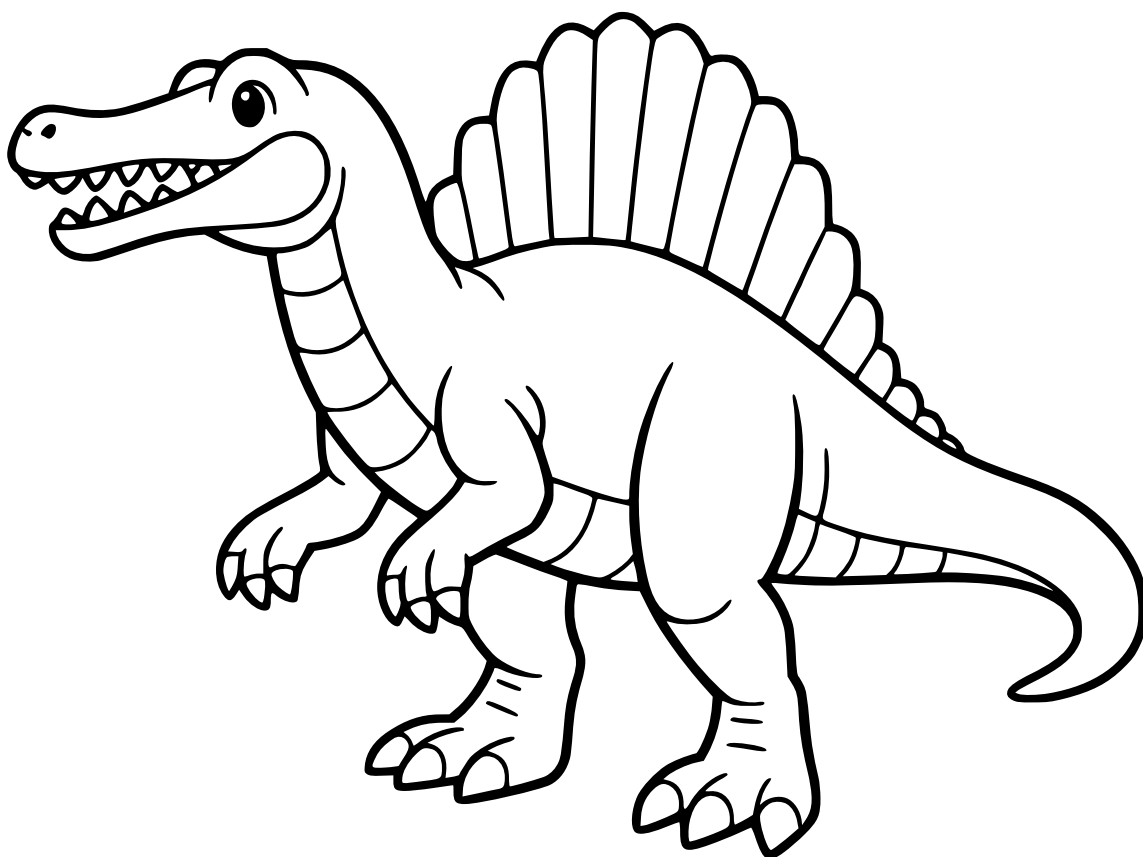




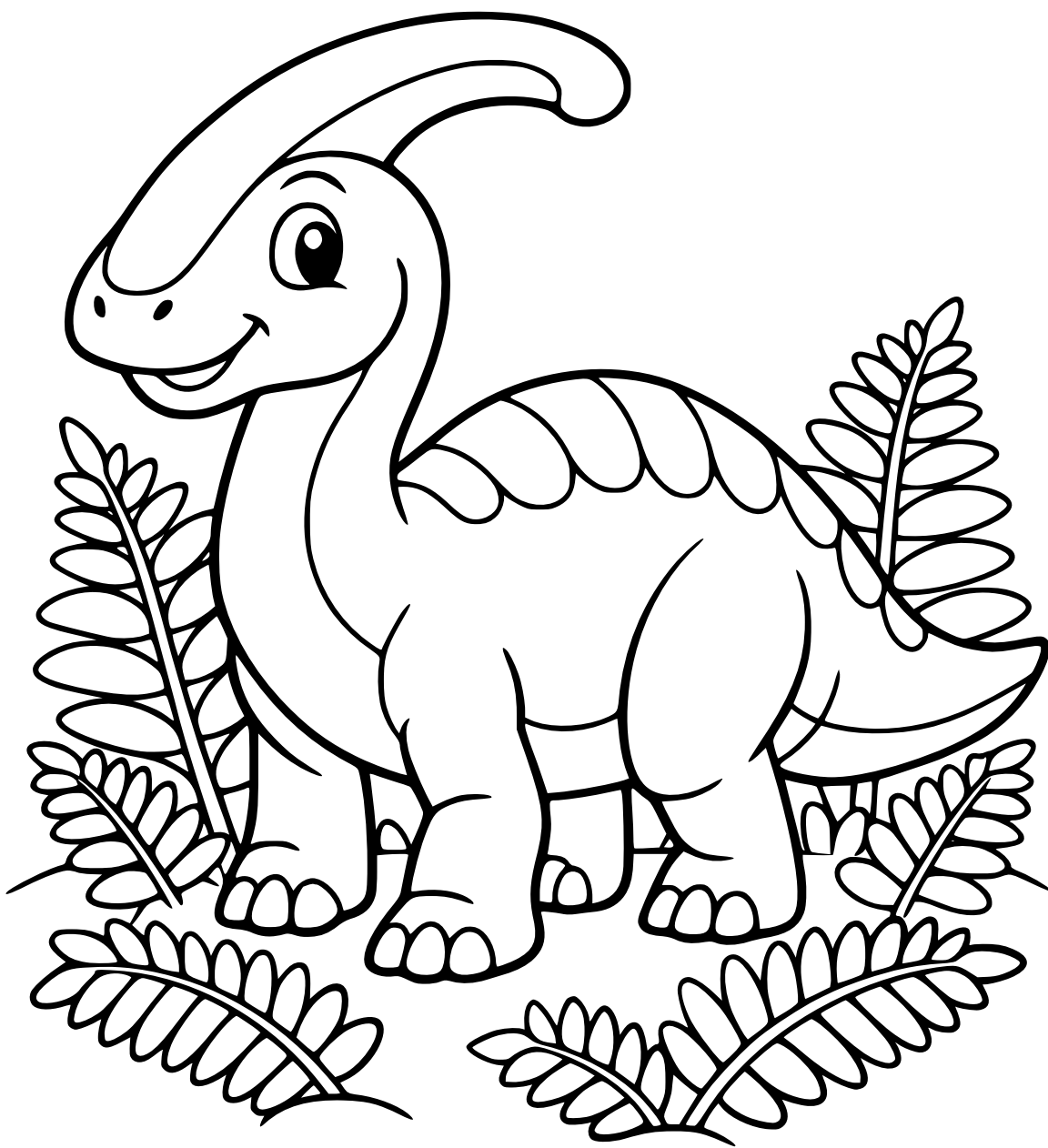


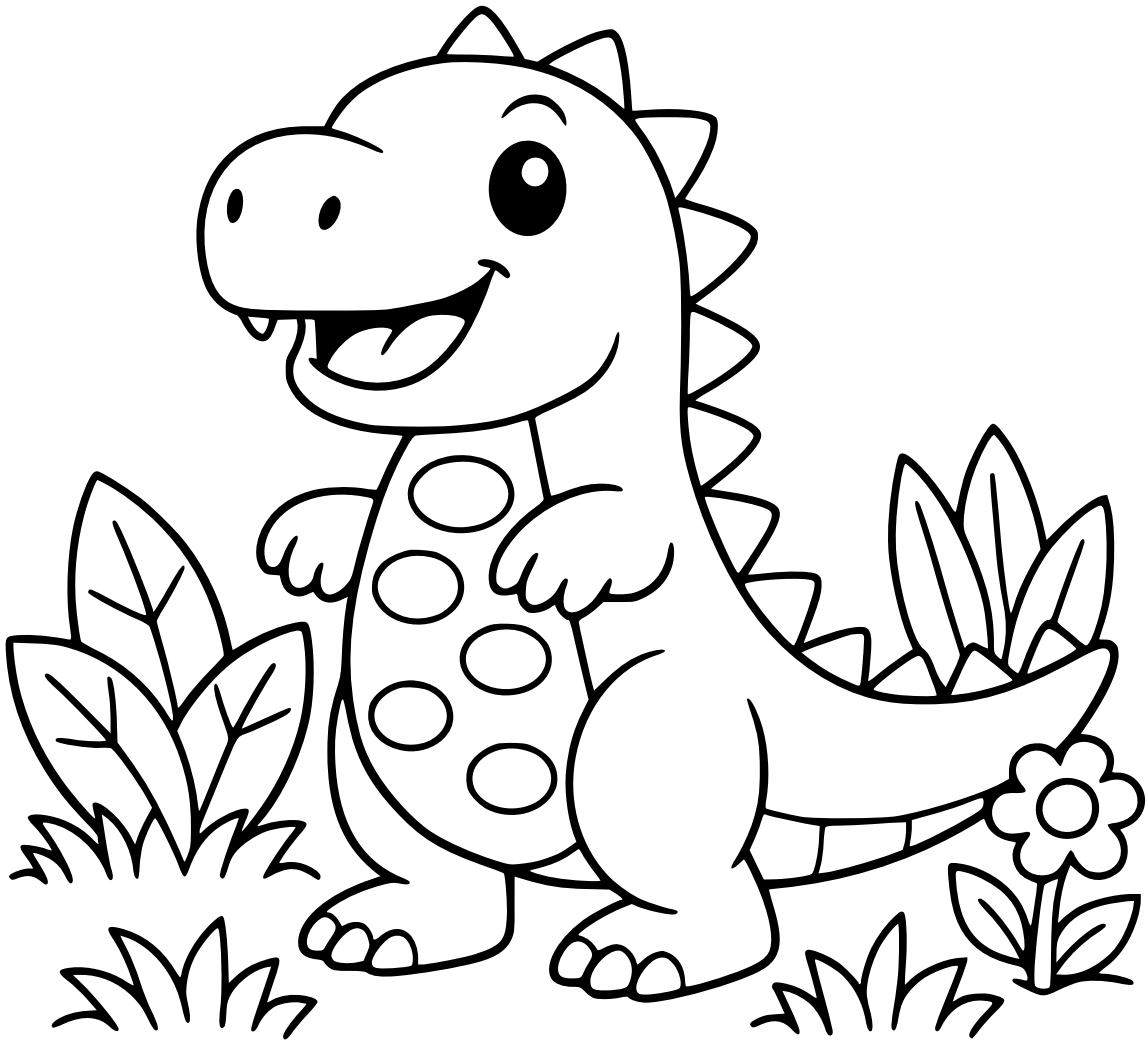


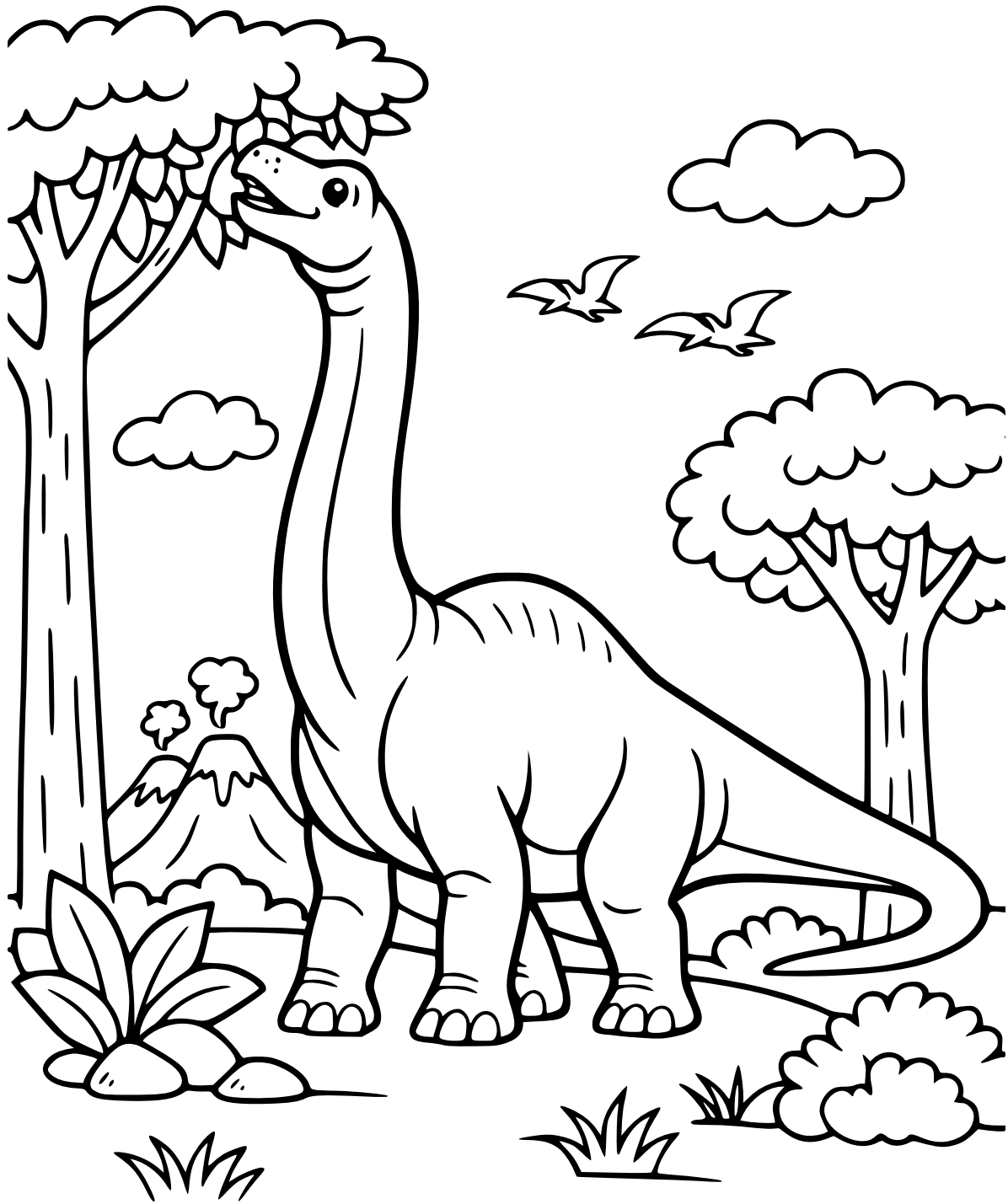


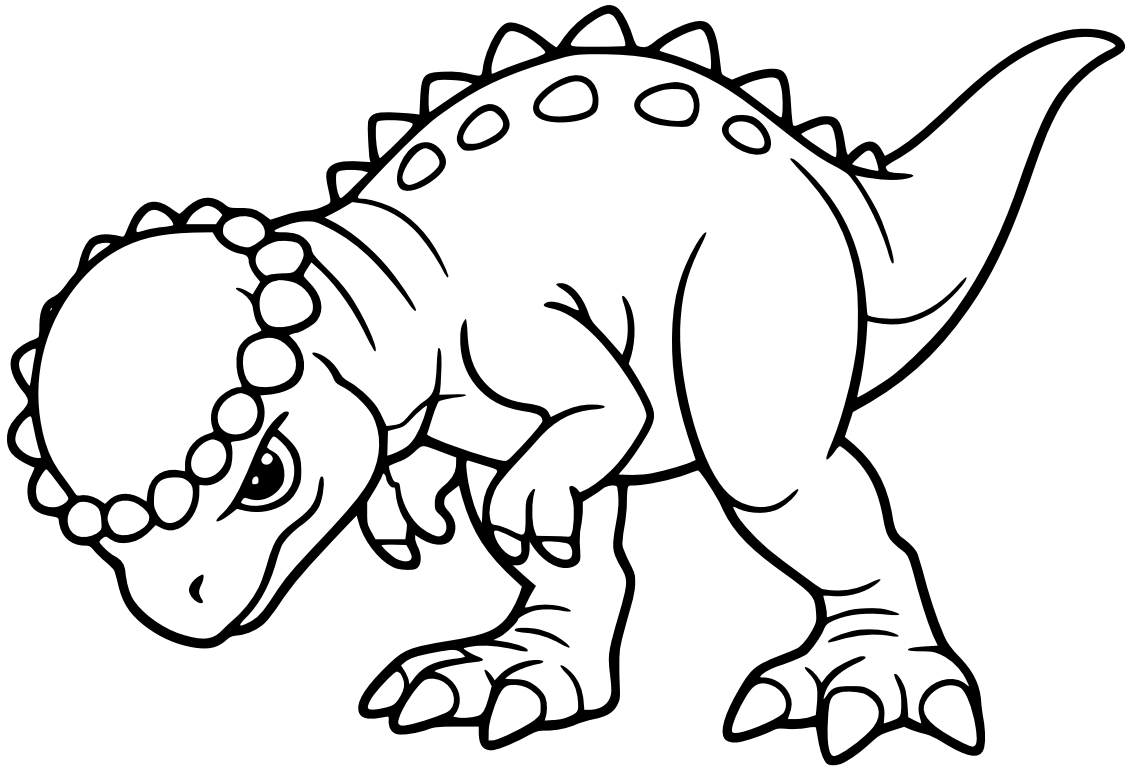


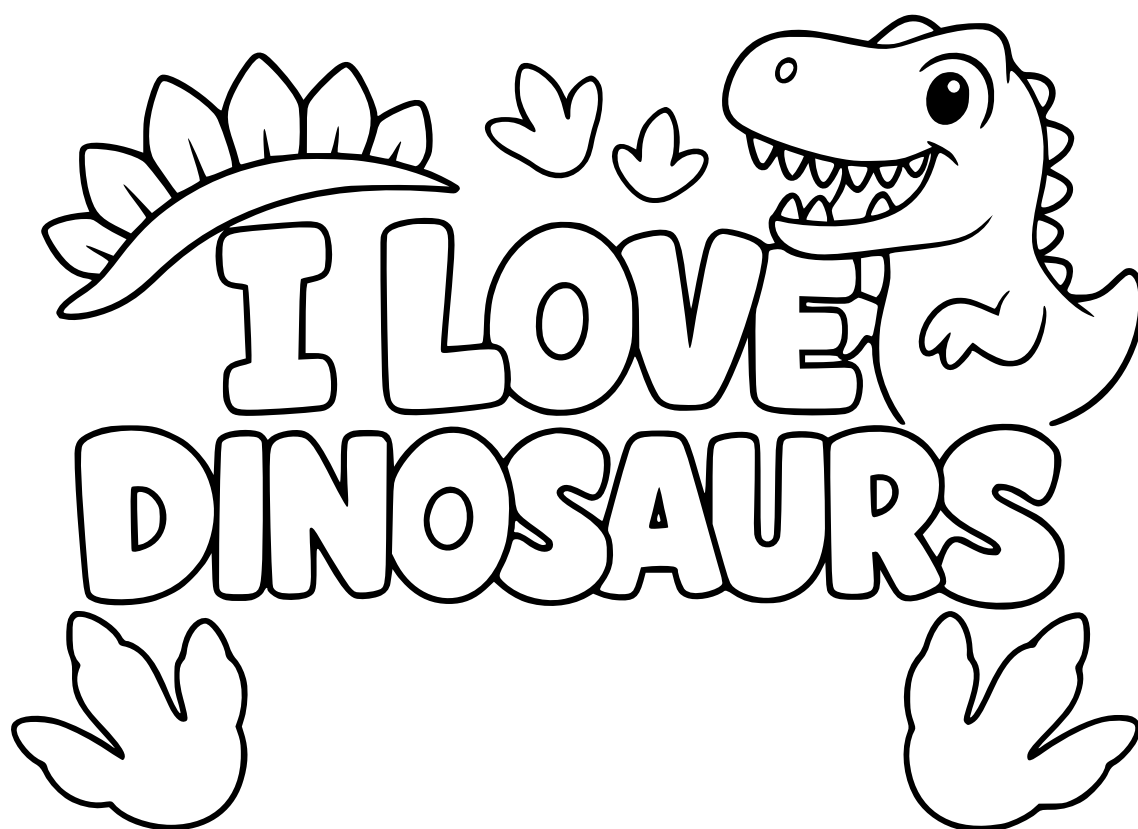


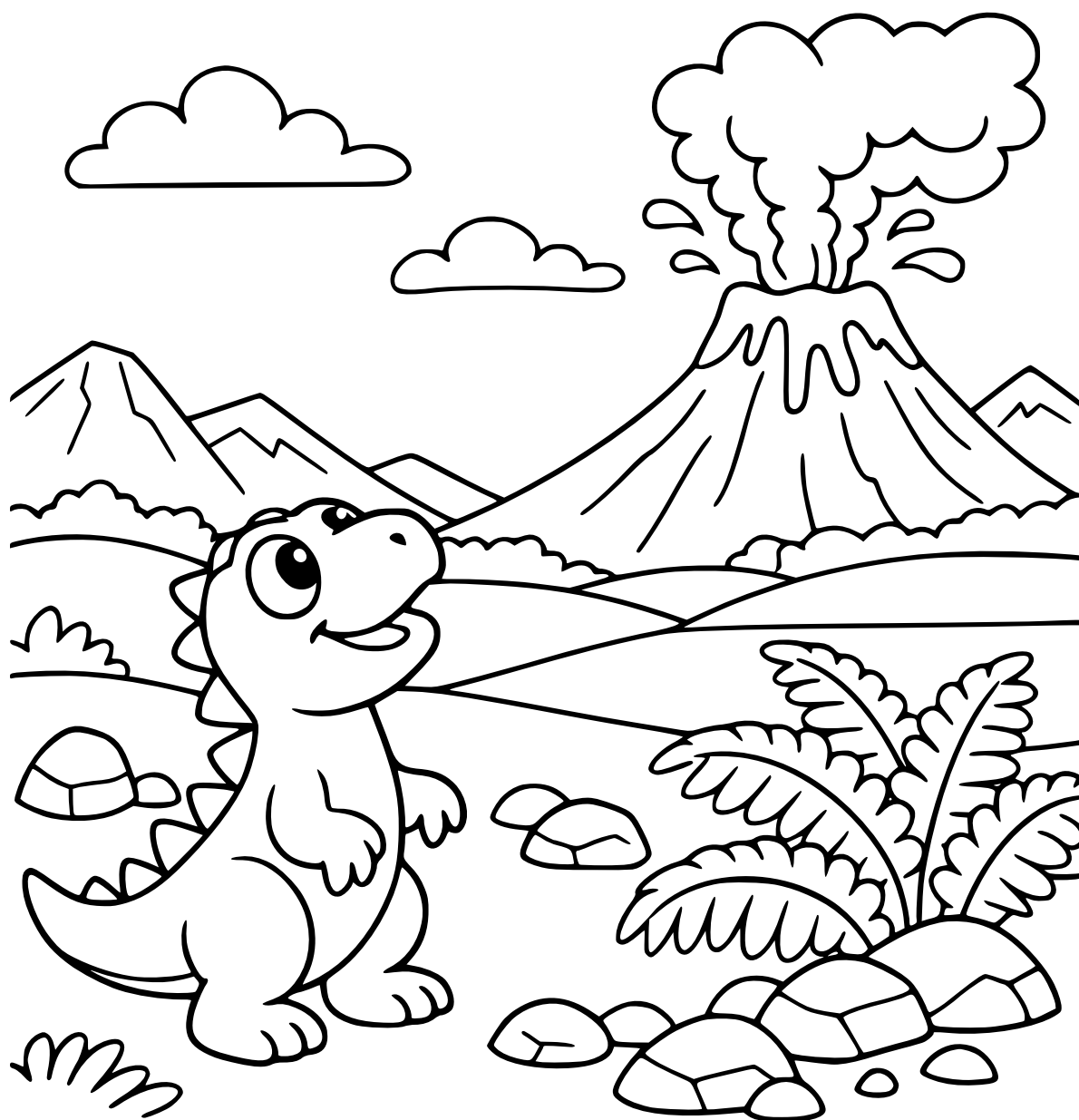


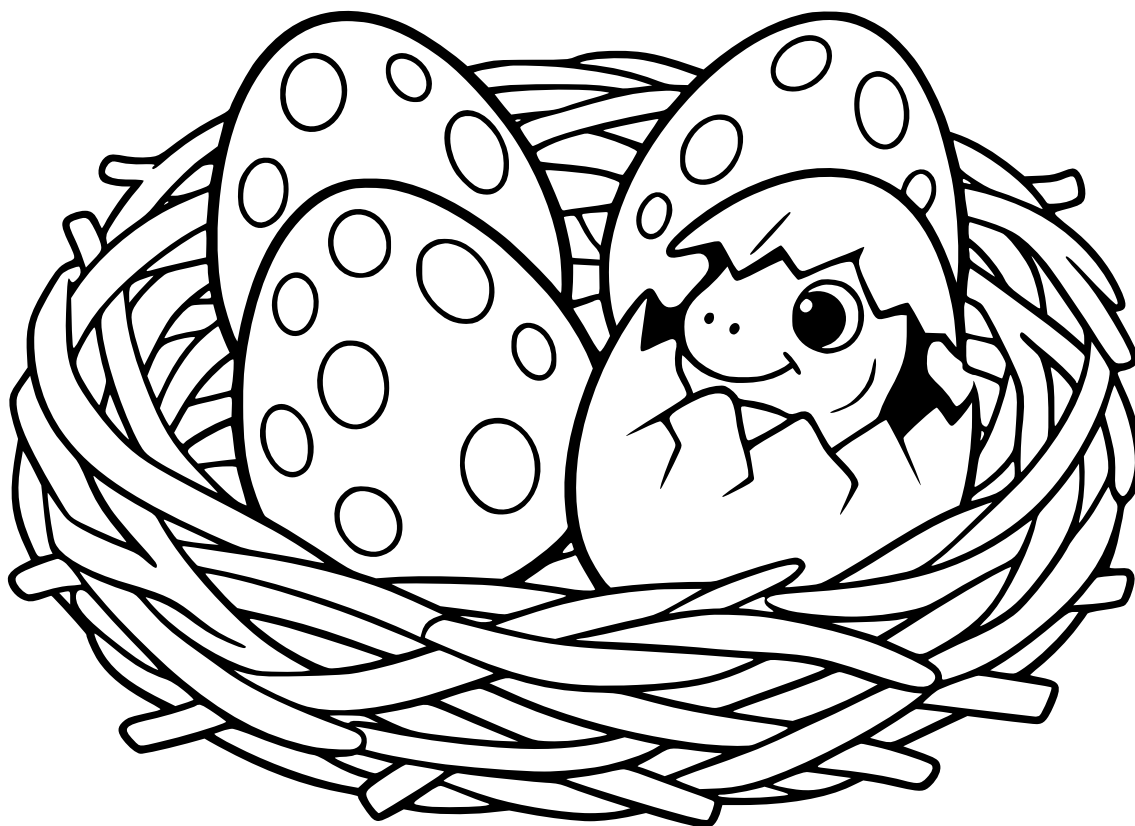


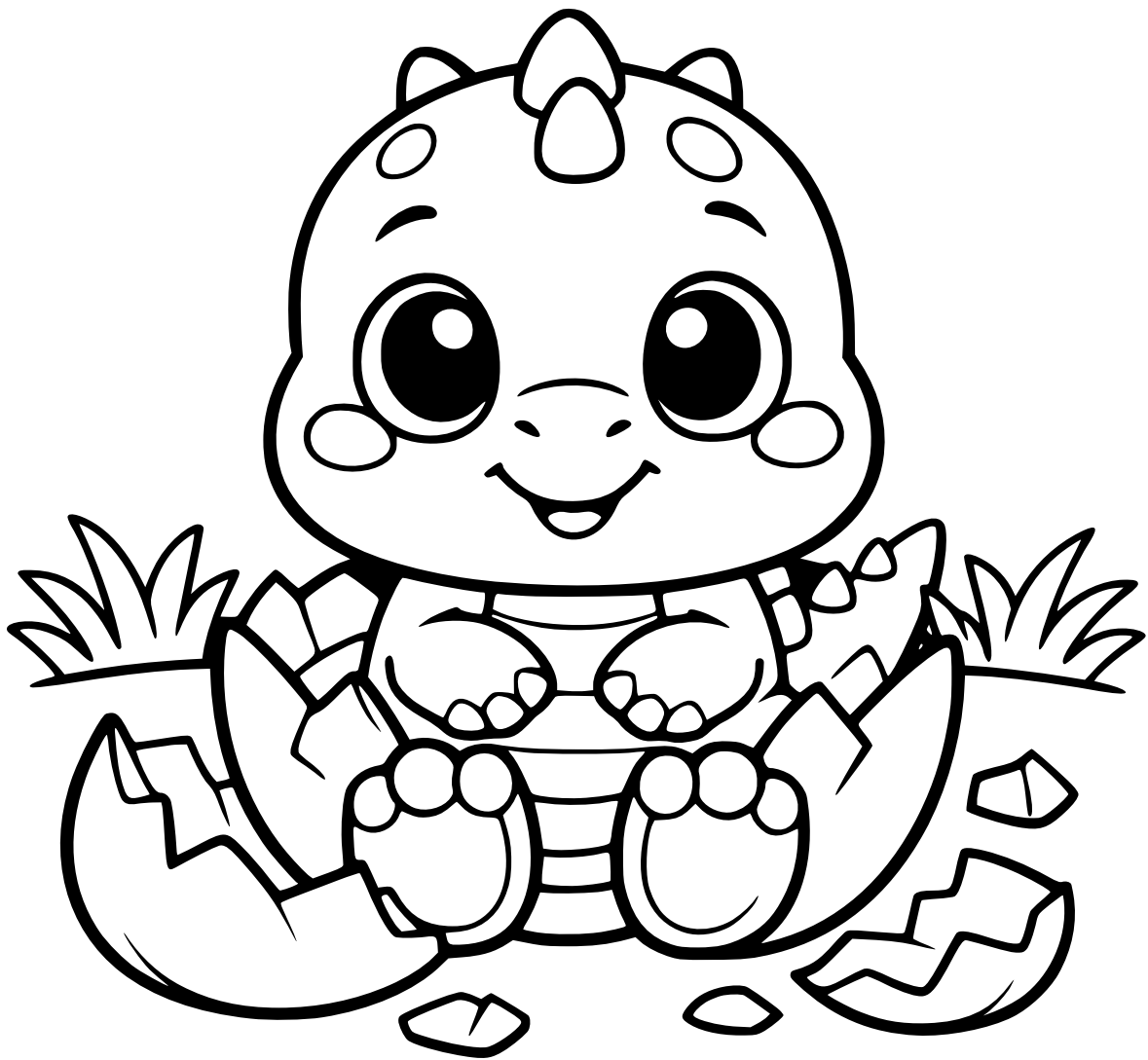








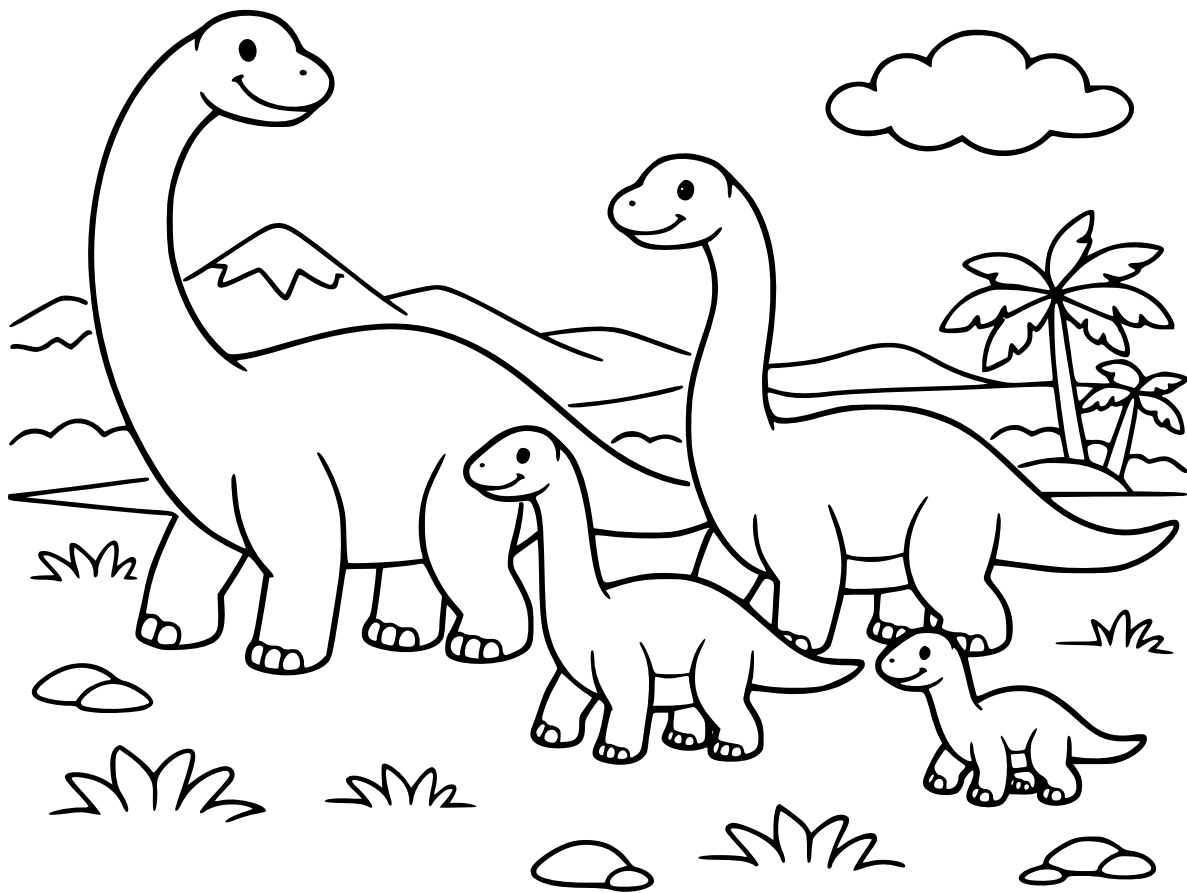


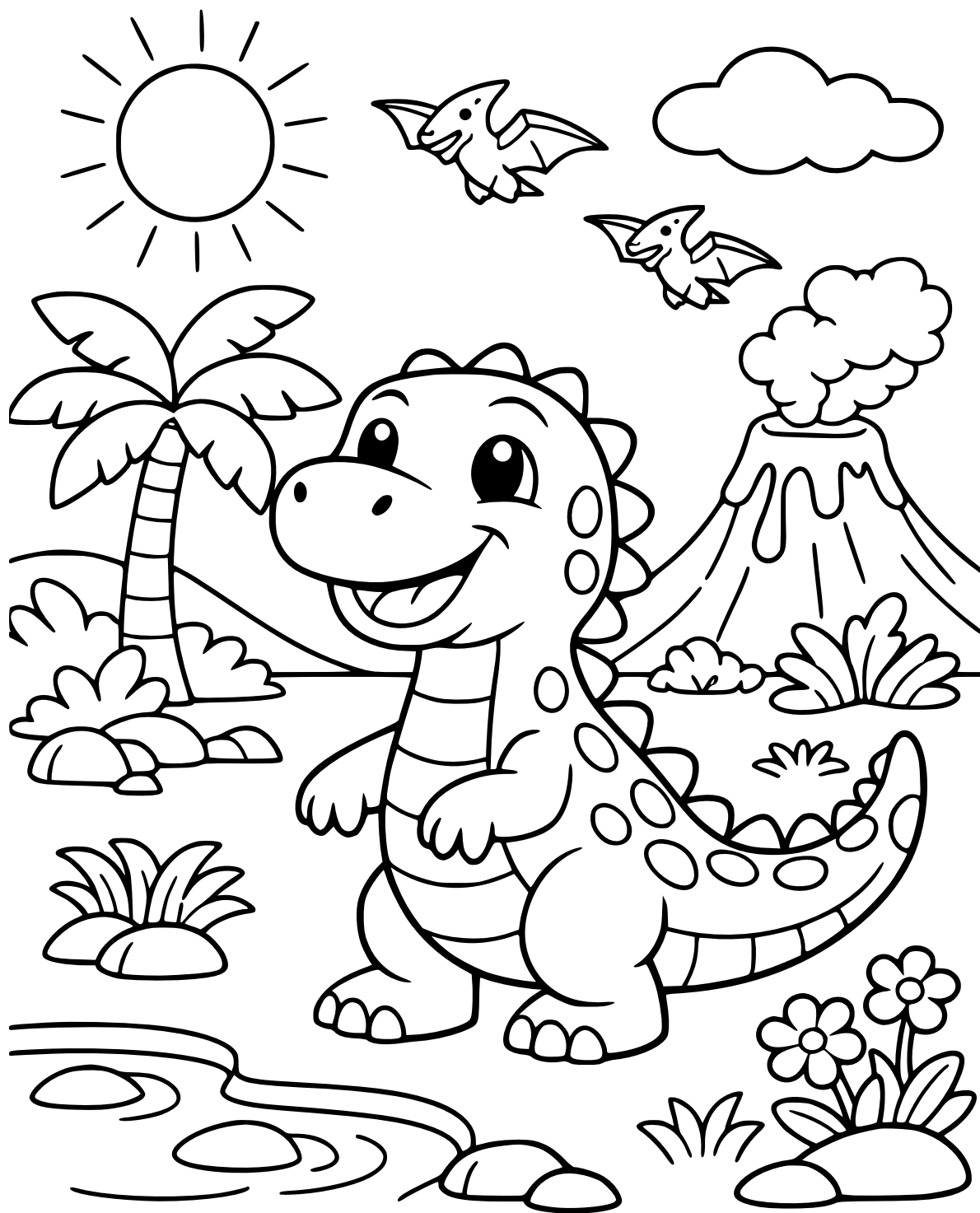


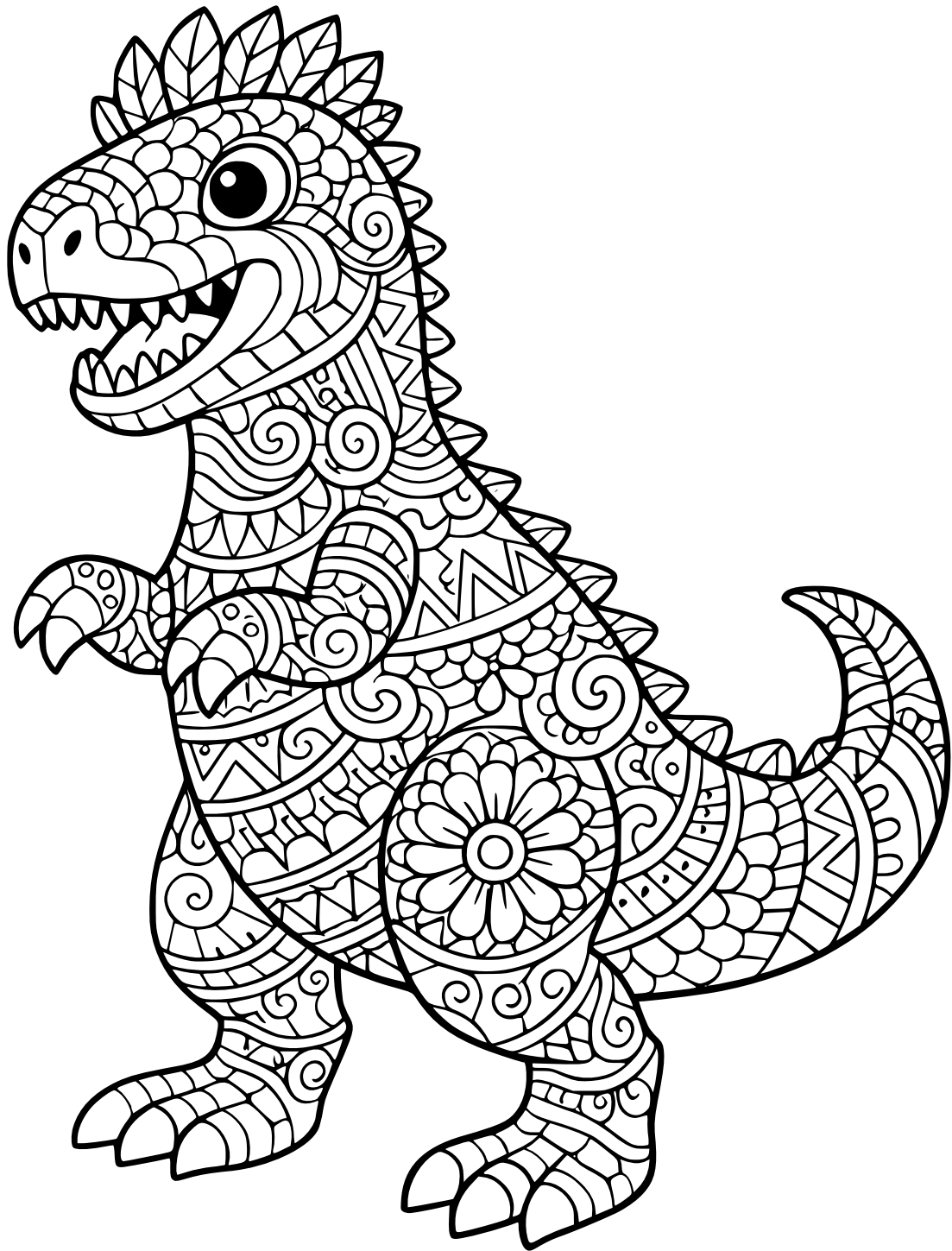


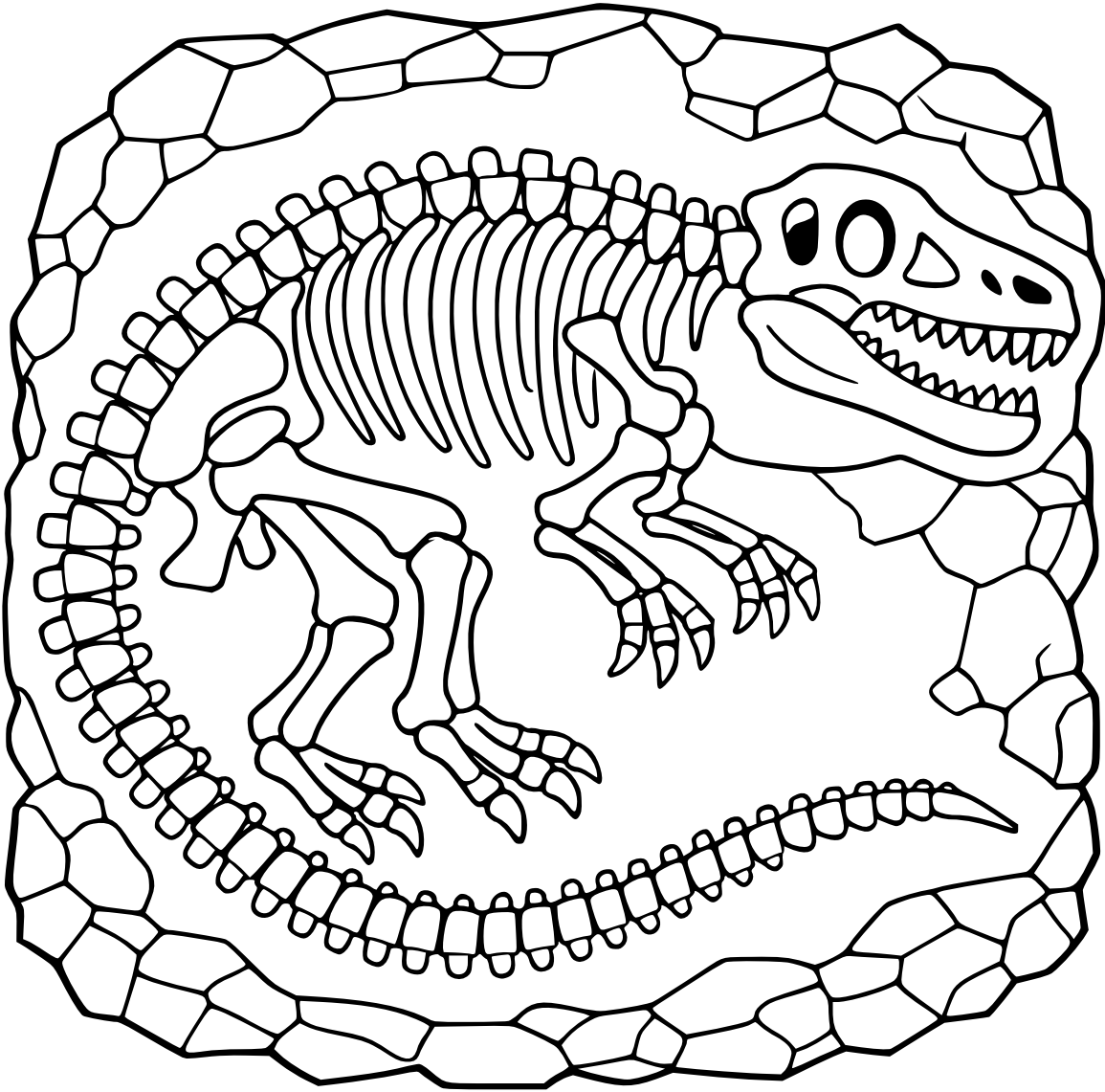


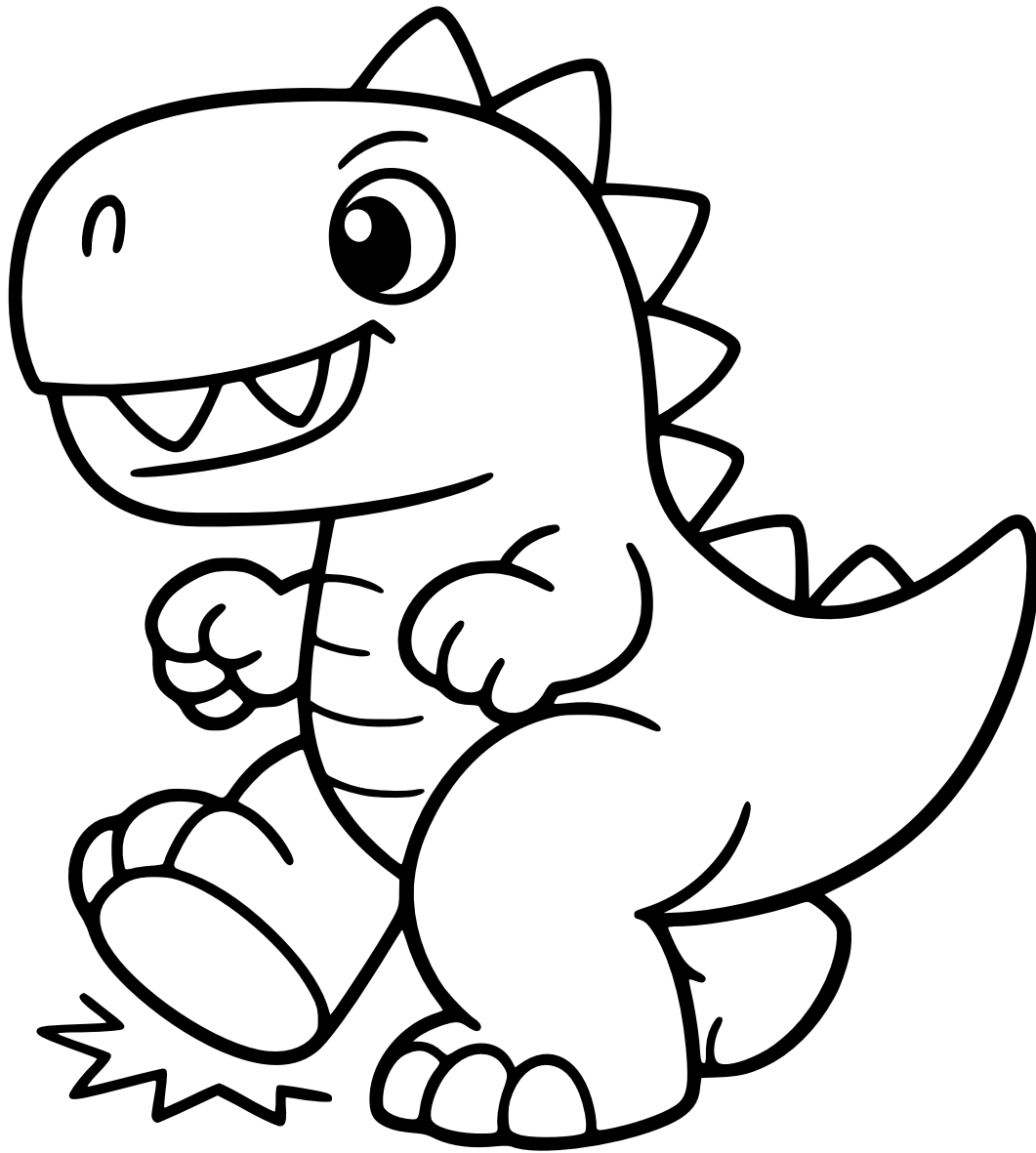




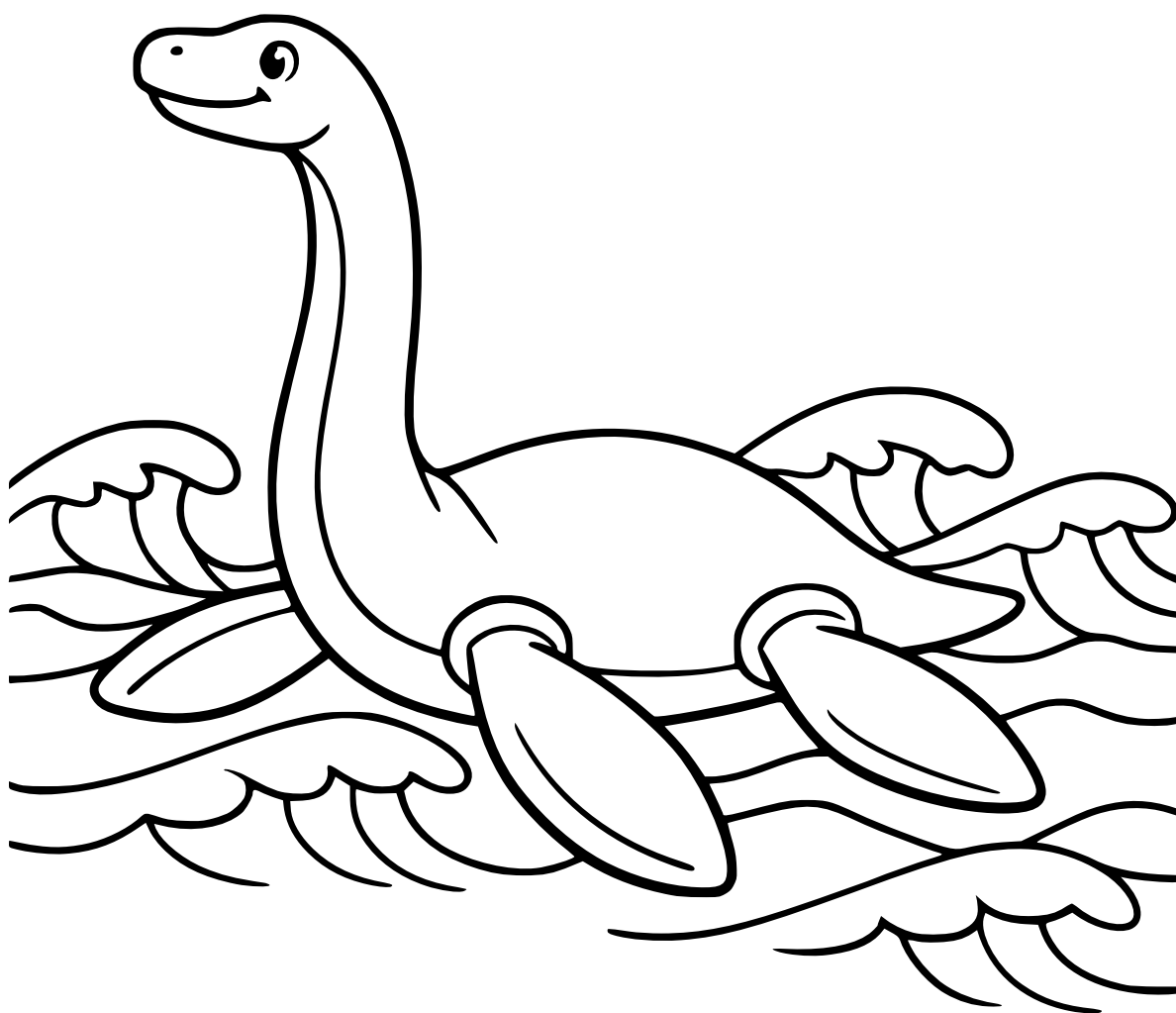


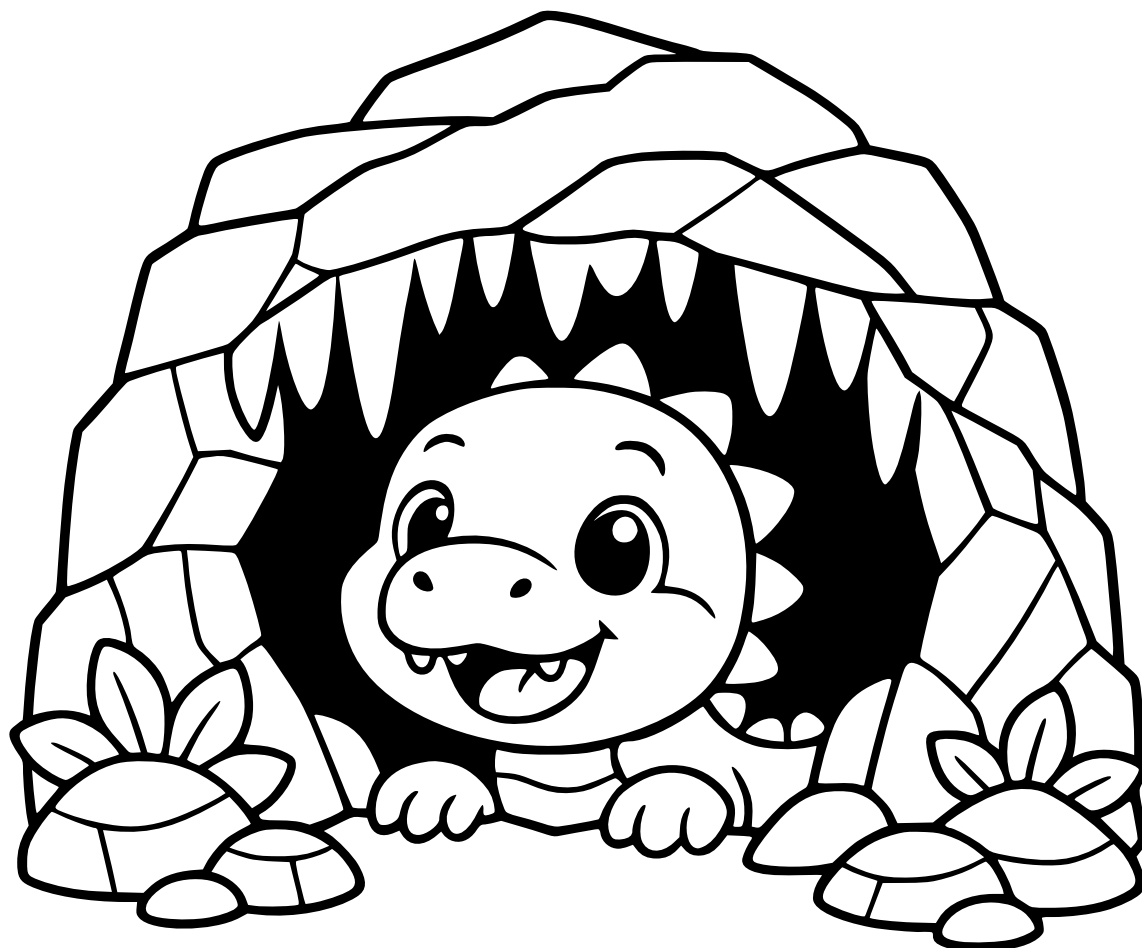


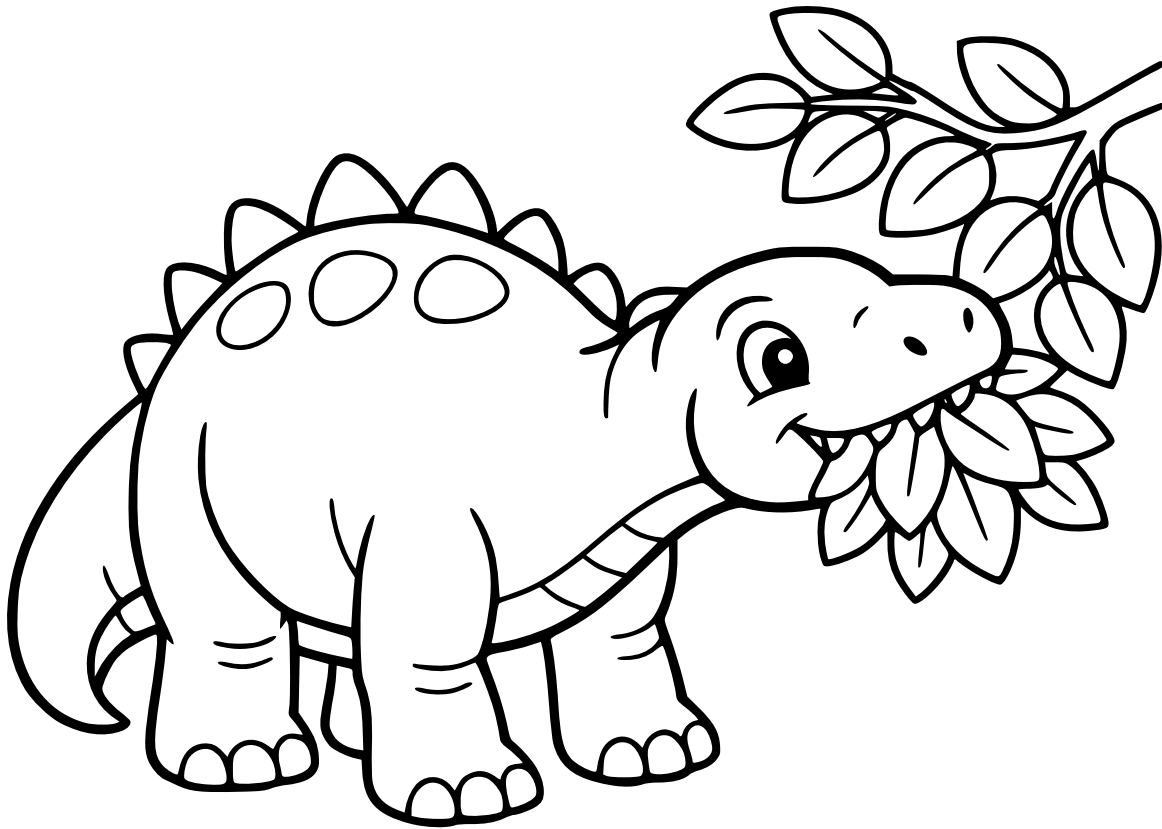


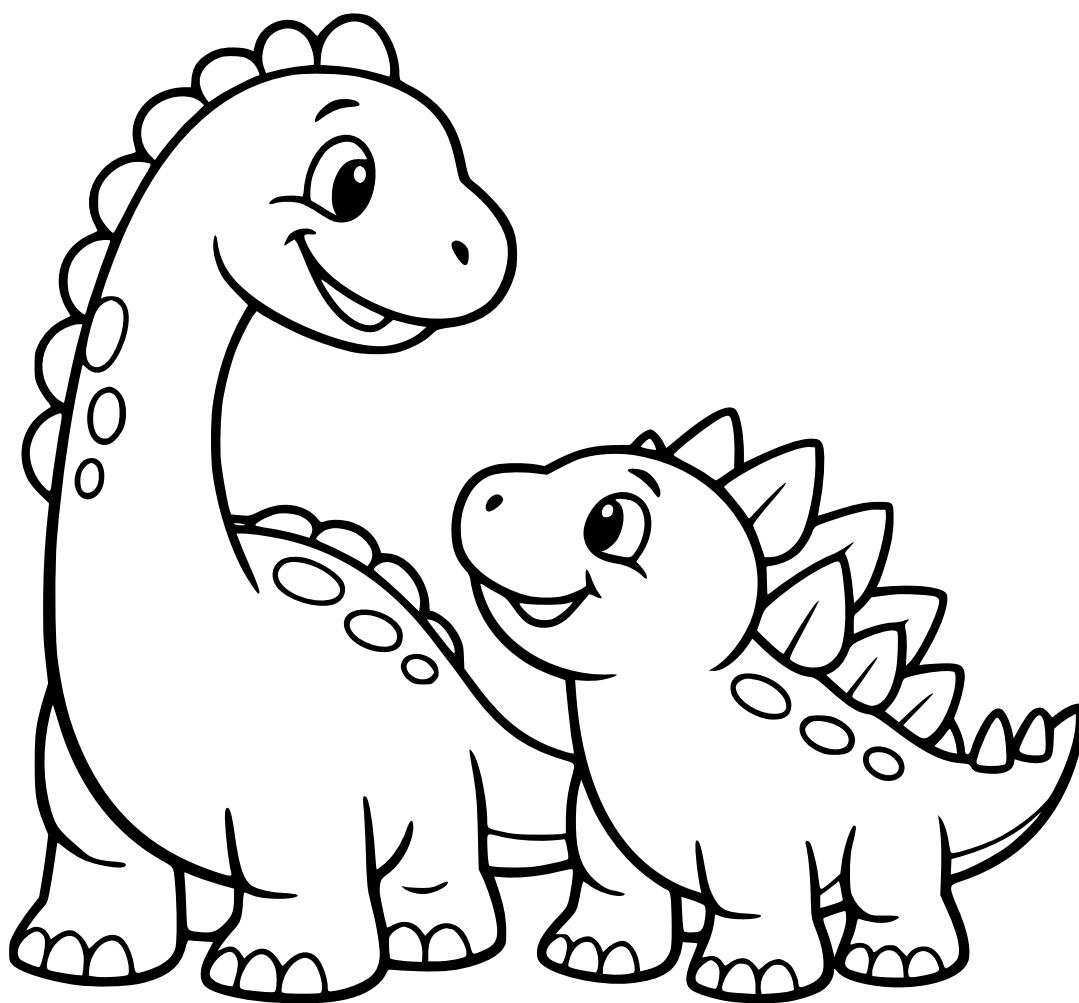




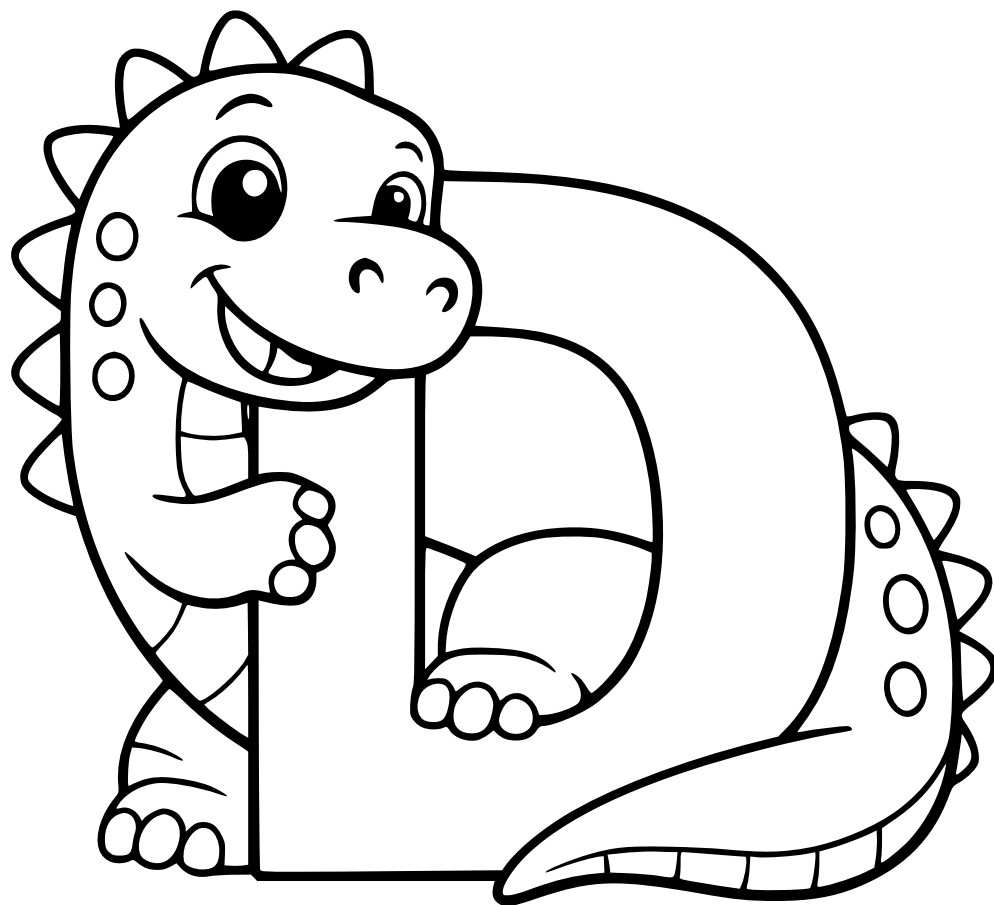
