About this collection

Welcome to our Mario coloring pages: a full collection of free printable designs from the Mushroom Kingdom, each one ready to download as a high quality PDF and print at home in seconds. No sign up, no watermarks: pick a page, press Download PDF, and you are coloring within a minute. Every drawing is original fan artwork in our own line style, sized for Letter and A4 paper, with bold, clear outlines that small hands can follow. You will find the plumber in the red cap at the wheel of a go kart, a kart flying off a jump ramp, a drift past a banana peel, a winners podium and a rainbow road floating in space, plus Yoshi guarding a spotted egg, Princess Peach among the roses, a grumpy little goomba on the march, and a whole shelf of power-ups: the super mushroom, the fire flower, the winking star, the question block, a spill of gold coins and a green shell. There are levels to color too, from the lava castle and the pipe with a plant in it to an underwater stage, a desert pyramid, cloud platforms, a ghost house, an icy slope and a jungle, and there is a kawaii version, a mandala, a color by number sheet, an eight bit pixel page and an extra easy sheet for toddlers. No printer? Every design can also be colored online right in your browser.

Where can you print free Mario coloring pages?

Right here, free, in about a minute. This page holds 30 printable Mario coloring pages drawn in our own line style, each one a high quality PDF sized for US Letter and A4 paper. There is no sign up and no watermark, and every design can also be colored online in your browser.

Five ways into the Mushroom Kingdom

The set is grouped so that no two pages feel alike. There is kart racing: the plumber at the wheel on the starting line under a chequered banner, a kart flying off a wooden jump ramp with all four wheels in the air, a hard drift past a banana peel, a three step winners podium under falling confetti and a rainbow road floating in outer space. There are the friends and foes of the kingdom, with Yoshi standing guard over a big spotted egg, Princess Peach in a ruffled gown among the roses of the castle garden and a grumpy little goomba stomping down a brick path. There are power-ups and items for anyone who would rather color objects than characters: the super mushroom, the fire flower in its brick planter, the winking star, the question block spitting coins, a treasure chest spilling gold, a green shell in the grass, a cracked brick wall and a nine square grid of items. There are worlds and levels, a whole tour of them: the lava castle with its drawbridge, the green pipe with a toothy plant leaning out, an underwater stage full of bubbles and coins, a desert pyramid, a stack of cloud platforms, a crooked ghost house, an icy slope with penguins and a jungle hung with vines. And there are drawing styles for every mood, from a kawaii chibi plumber and an extra easy sheet with very thick lines to an eight bit pixel page, a Mushroom Kingdom mandala, a color by number mushroom and a star packed edge to edge with zentangle pattern.

Who is who on these pages

If your child knows the games they will name everyone before you finish printing, but here is the short version for the rest of us. The plumber in the cap and dungarees is Mario, and you will find him driving the kart on the starting line, shrunk to a chibi with a wrench in his hand, drawn extra simple for small hands and rebuilt out of pixels on a grid. Yoshi is the friendly green dinosaur, and the spotted egg he is guarding is where more of him comes from. Princess Peach lives in the castle behind the roses and wears the crown. A goomba is the grumpy walking mushroom that will not get out of your way. Everything else on these pages, the coins, the blocks, the pipes, the shells and the power-ups, belongs to the kingdom itself, which is why so many of them make good pages on their own.

Coloring ideas for red caps, green shells and gold coins

Two colors do most of the work here: a strong red and a deep blue for the plumber, kept flat and even so the small things can carry the detail. Save your effort for the white gloves, the brown boots and the moustache. Gold coins and the star look best with yellow laid down first and a little orange rubbed around the rim, with one small patch left white for shine. On the shell, keep the dome a single bright green and change to a warm cream on the rim so it reads as two materials instead of one flat blob. The castle and the pyramid are the pages to be bold on: grey stone is fine, but orange and yellow lava under the drawbridge lifts the whole drawing. On the kart pages, color the smoke and speed lines a pale blue or grey instead of leaving them white and the whole picture starts moving. The mandala, the zentangle star and the color by number mushroom want the opposite approach: pick four colors, repeat them around the rings, and the symmetry does the work for you. Markers need thicker paper (cardstock) so they do not bleed through; crayons, pencils and gel pens are happy on plain printer paper. More advice is in our how-to-print guide.

The best page for every age

Toddlers should start with the extra easy plumber: very thick lines, a few large shapes and nothing fiddly, with the super mushroom and the green shell close behind. Kids from about four to eight go straight for the kart racing set, the ghost house, the ice level with the penguins and the question block. Older kids and grown-ups tend to pick the Mushroom Kingdom mandala, the zentangle star, the nine item grid and the eight bit pixel page, which color like a pattern rather than a picture and can take a whole evening. The color by number mushroom is the one to hand a child who says they do not know what colors to use. Running a party? Print a stack of the starting line page and hand out red, green and gold pencils, or print the item grid, cut the nine squares apart and use them as name cards at the table. Printing for a whole class is fine, the details are in our licensing policy.

More cartoon coloring pages

If a fast blue hedgehog is the other favorite in your house, our Sonic coloring pages run loops, rings and spin dashes in the same line style, and our Pokemon coloring pages fill a whole page with creatures to catch. For younger colorers, the Bluey coloring pages and the Hello Kitty coloring pages are gentler and just as bold, and there is a blue alien making trouble over on our Stitch coloring pages. For older kids who want a fight instead of a race, our Goku coloring pages hold energy beams, powered up hair and the seven star orbs. The whole cast lives together in our cartoon coloring pages hub, and if the printer is out of ink you can paint any of these in our online coloring studio.

How to print

Every page is sized for US Letter and prints on A4 without cropping if you set your printer to "fit to page". Print single-sided so colors do not show through, and use cardstock if you plan to use markers. There are no watermarks and no sign-up, on any page.

Terms of use

Free for personal, classroom and library use. Print as many copies as you need. Please do not re-sell these pages or re-host the file: link to the collection page instead, so the book stays up to date.

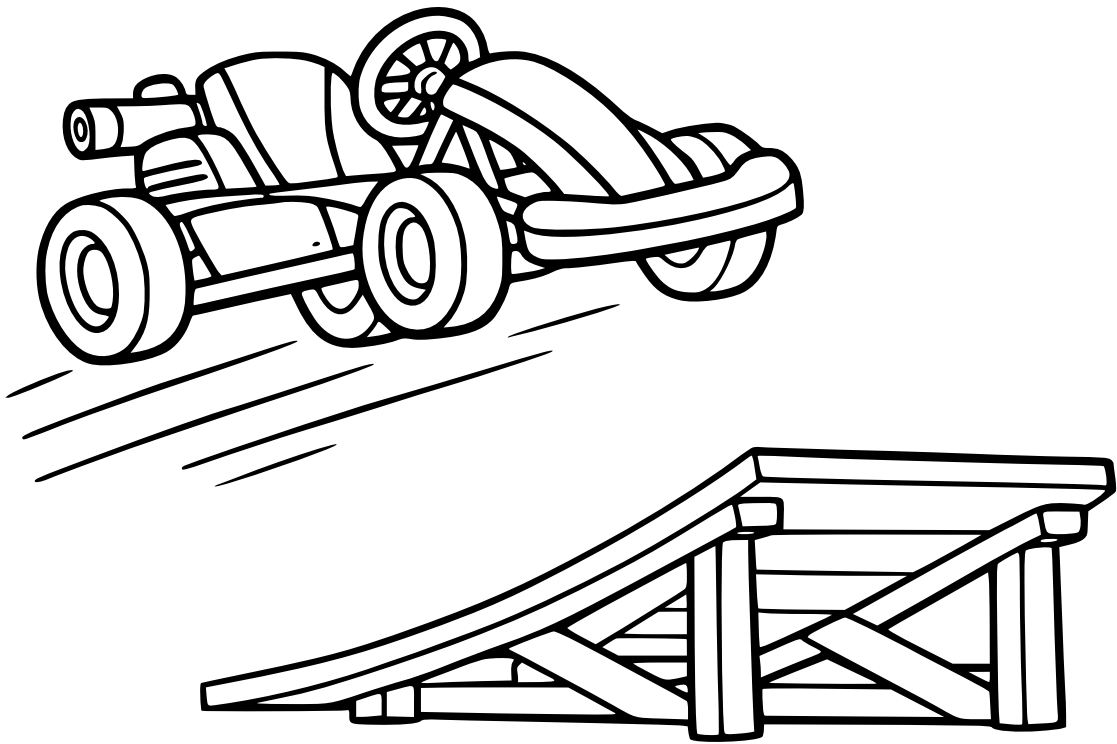
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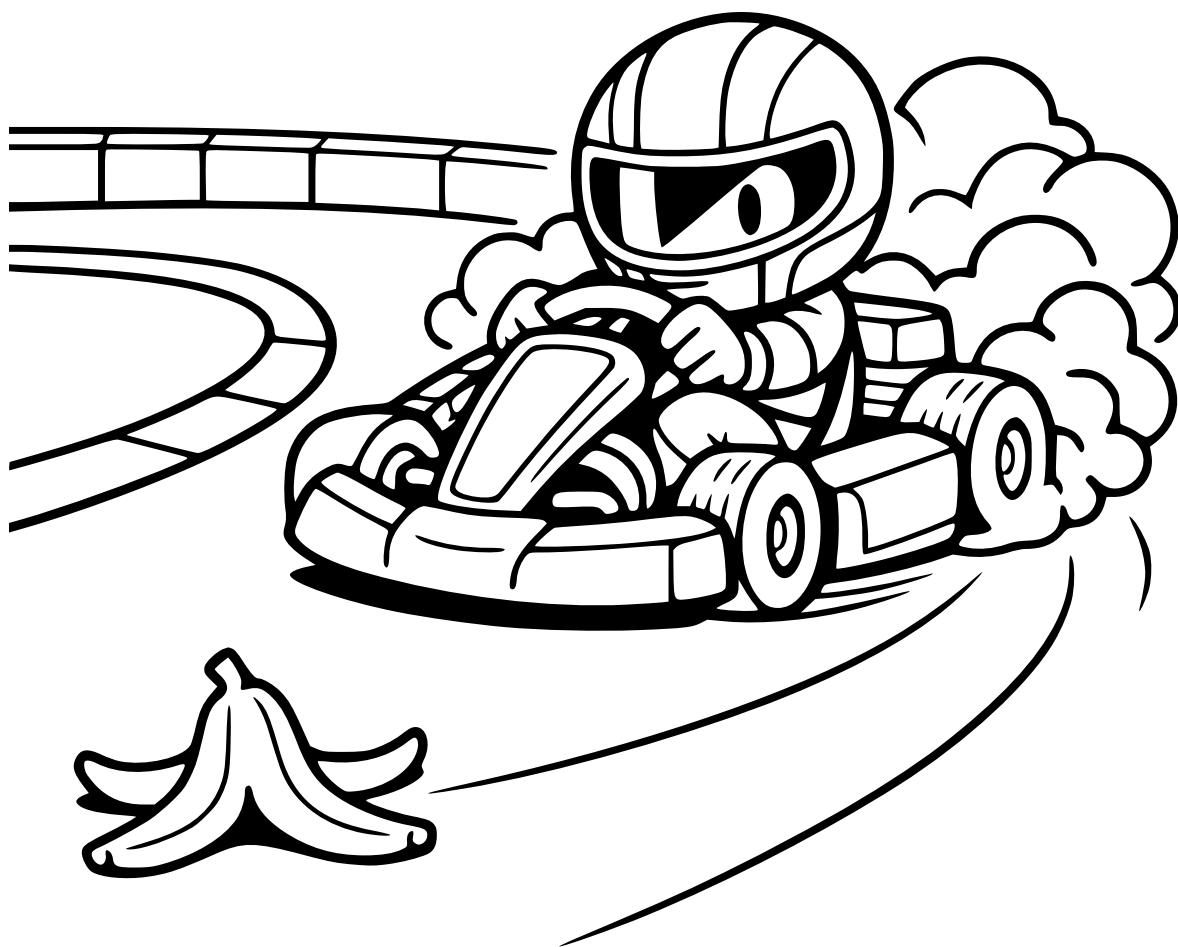
What is inside

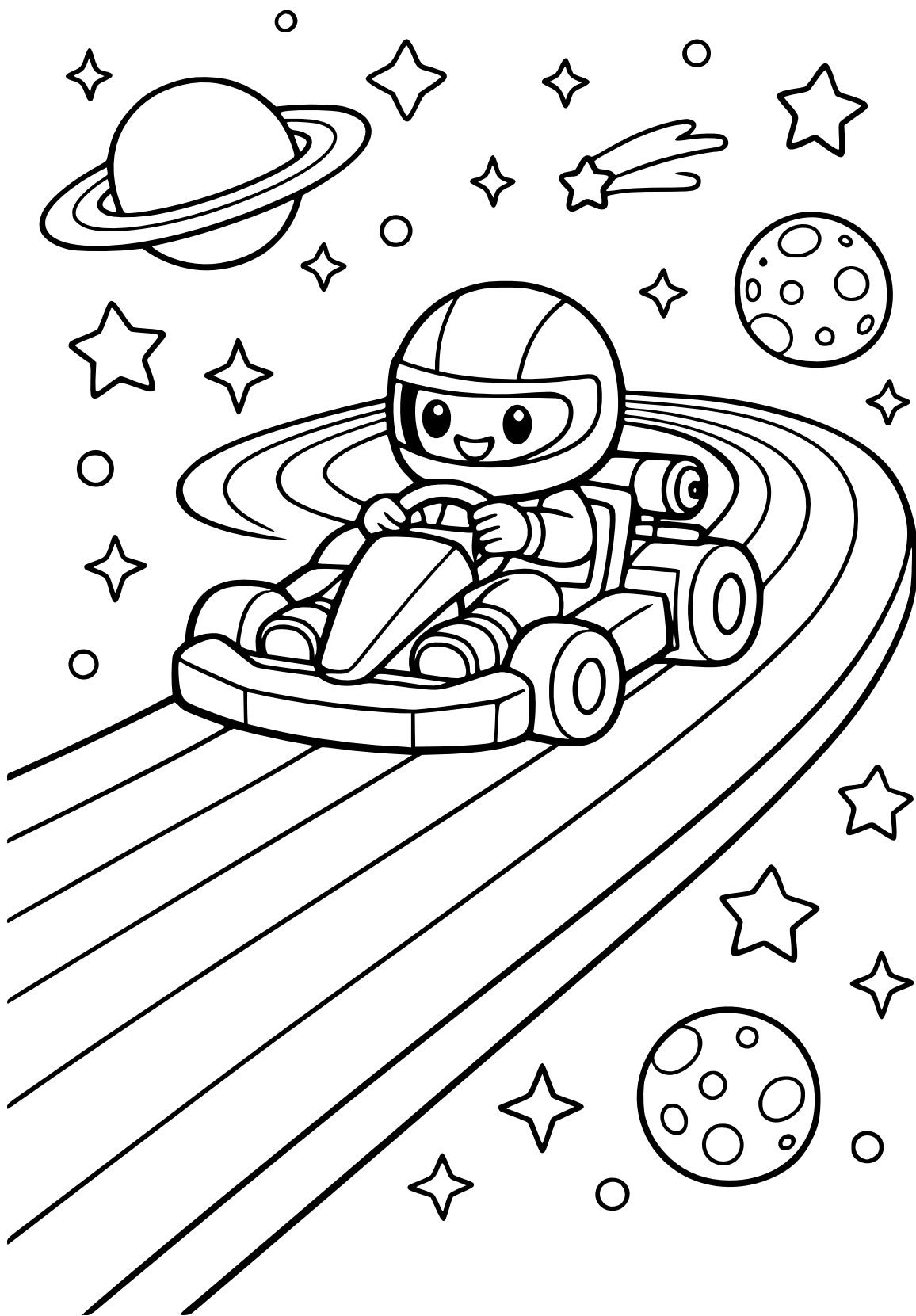
1. On the Starting Line	7	12. The Question Block	18
Mario grips the wheel of his go kart on the starting line while a chequered banner stretches right across the track.		A floating cube block wears a question mark on every visible face while three round coins pop out of its lid in a neat arc.	
2. Off the Jump Ramp	8	13. A Pile of Coins	19
A go kart launches off the end of a wooden ramp with all four wheels in the air and motion lines streaking underneath.		Round coins stamped with a star spill out of an open wooden chest and stack up into a tall glittering pile.

Yoshi stands guard beside a big spotted egg tucked into tall grass, his long tail curled protectively around the nest.		A battlemented castle raises its pointed towers and little flags above a wooden drawbridge crossing a moat of bubbling lava.	
7. Princess Peach in the Garden	13	18. The Warp Pipe	24
Princess Peach stands among the rose bushes of the castle garden in a long ruffled gown, her small crown set on wavy hair.		A fat green warp pipe rises out of a grassy field and a toothy piranha plant leans right out of the opening.	
8. The Grumpy Goomba	14	19. The Underwater Level	25
A goomba, the grumpy little walking mushroom with heavy eyebrows, stomps along a brick path on two tiny bare feet.		An underwater level fills with swaying seaweed, coral rocks, a cheerful fish and coins floating up through a stream of bubbles.	
9. The Super Mushroom	15	20. The Desert Level	26
The super mushroom power up sits in the grass, its tall spotted cap resting above two wide round cartoon eyes.		A stepped stone pyramid, a tall cactus and a green pipe poke out of the sand under a round desert sun.	
10. The Fire Flower	16	21. The Sky Level	27
The fire flower smiles out of a small brick planter, its layered rounded petals wrapped around two big friendly eyes.		Cloud platforms float in a stack joined by square blocks, coins hang in the air and a small flag marks the highest cloud.	
11. The Invincibility Star	17	22. The Ghost House	28
The five pointed super star winks as it bounces above a row of blocks, sparkle lines shooting off every one of its tips.		A crooked haunted house leans over its shuttered windows while a cheerful round ghost floats out of the open doorway.	
		23. The Ice Level	29
		A steep icy slope runs past a small round igloo where two chubby penguins wait under fat falling snowflakes.	

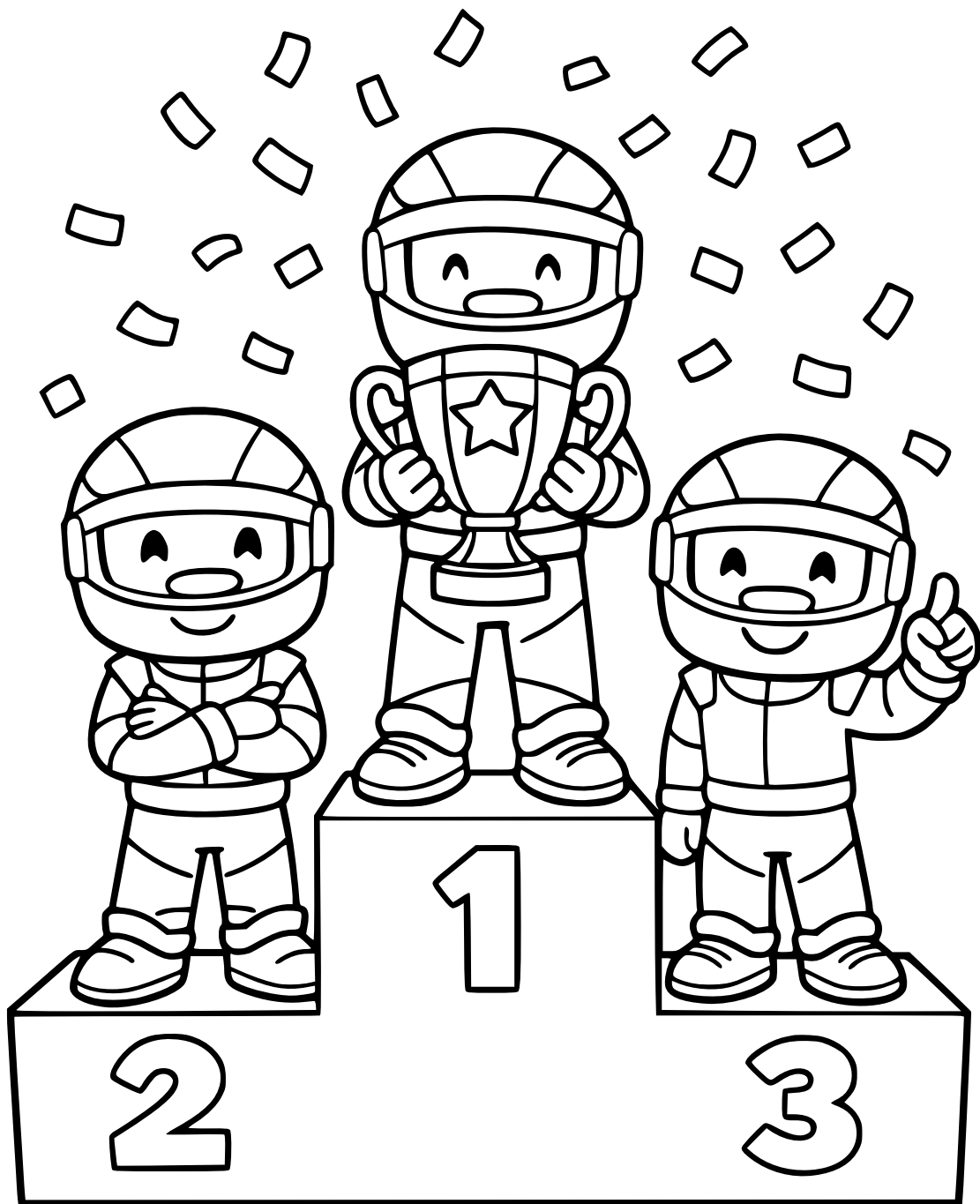
24. The Jungle Level	30
Thick vines hang past broad jungle leaves and a wooden platform, with a bunch of bananas swinging from a branch.	
25. Kawaii Mini Mario	31
A chibi Mario shrinks down to a huge round head, enormous sparkling eyes, round blush cheeks and two very stubby arms.	
26. Easy Mario for Toddlers	32
An extra easy Mario drawn in very thick lines with only a few big shapes, sized for the smallest hands to fill in.	
27. Eight Bit Pixel Mario	33
An eight bit Mario is built from big outlined squares on a visible grid, ready to be colored one block at a time.	
28. Mushroom Kingdom Mandala	34
Rings of mushrooms, stars, coins, flowers and square blocks circle one central star to build a single symmetrical mandala.	
29. Color by Number Mushroom	35
A spotted cap mushroom is split into clearly separated areas, each holding a small printed number to color by.	
30. Zentangle Star	36
One big five pointed star is packed edge to edge with zentangle spirals, waves, dots and tiny scallops.	

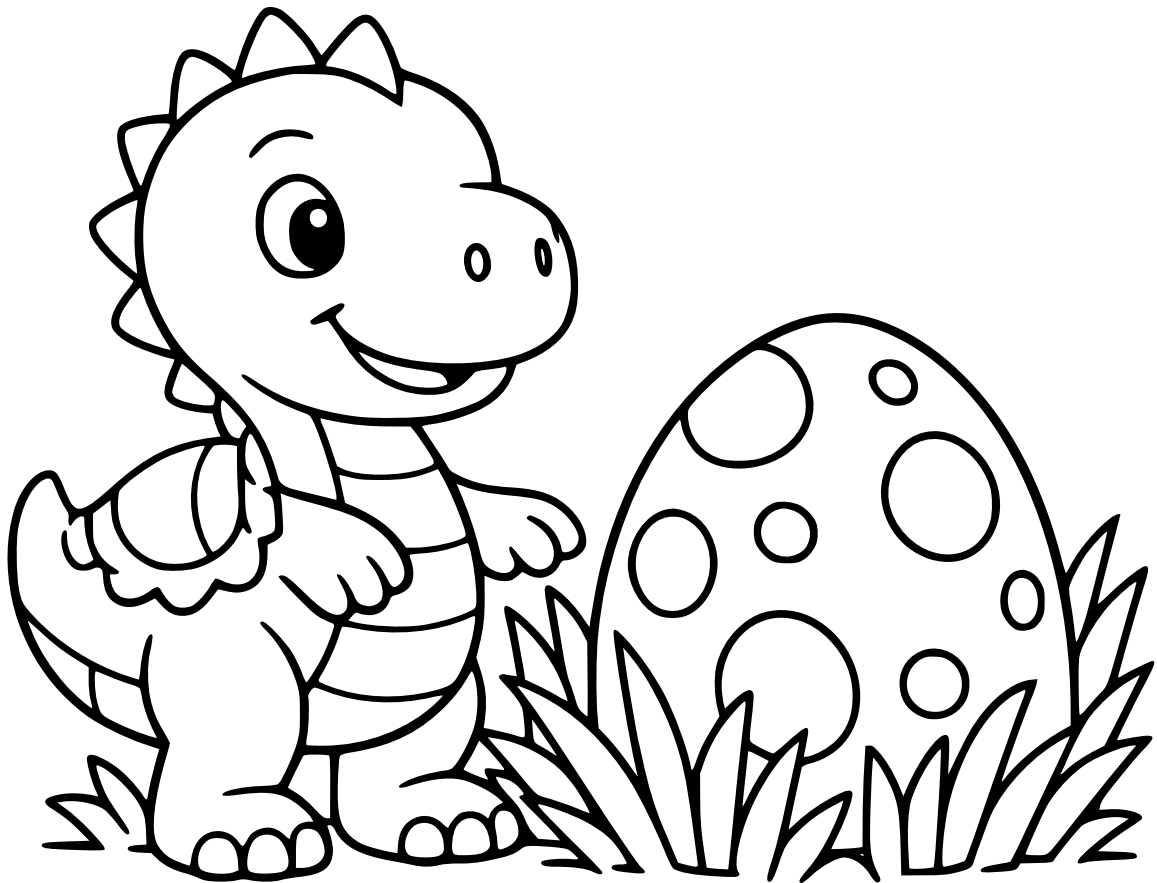




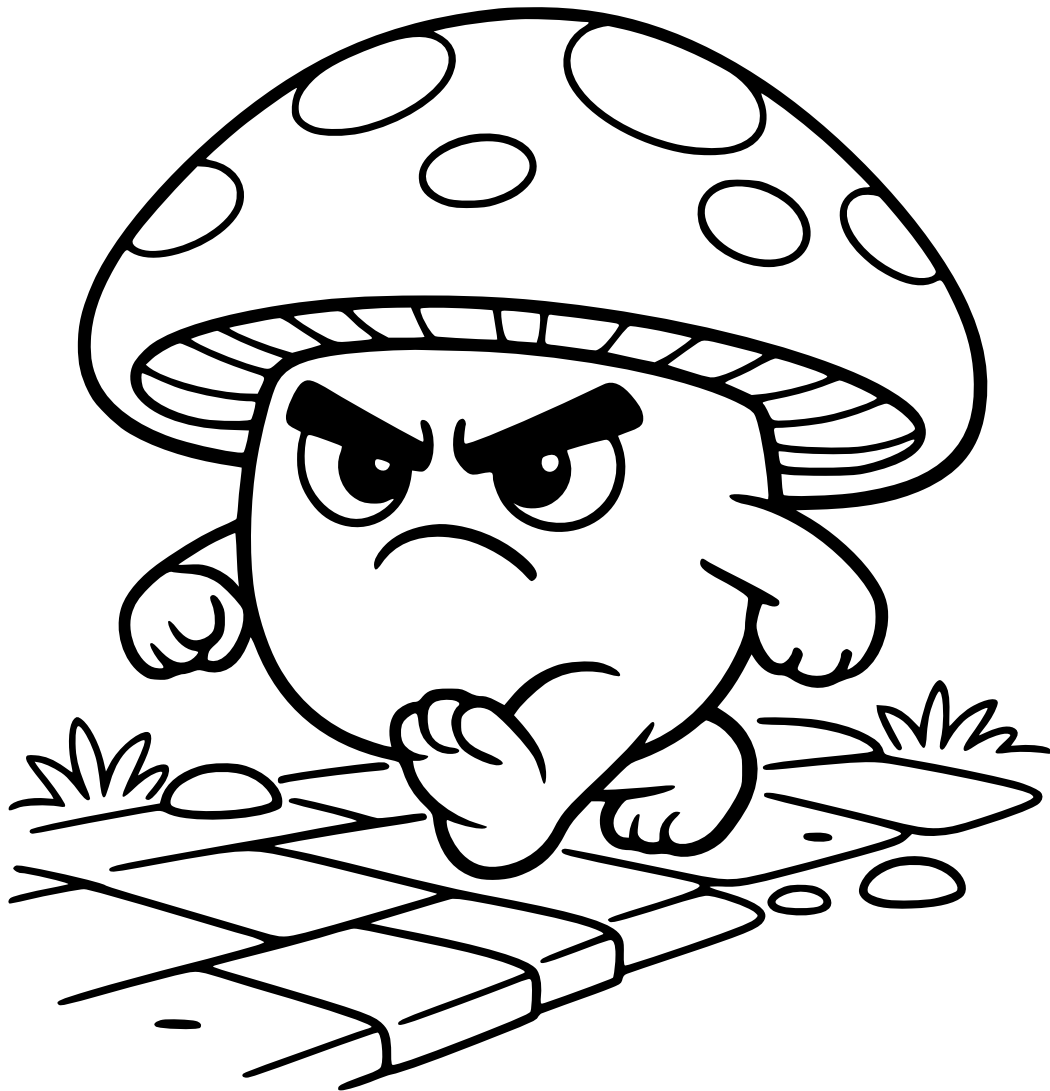


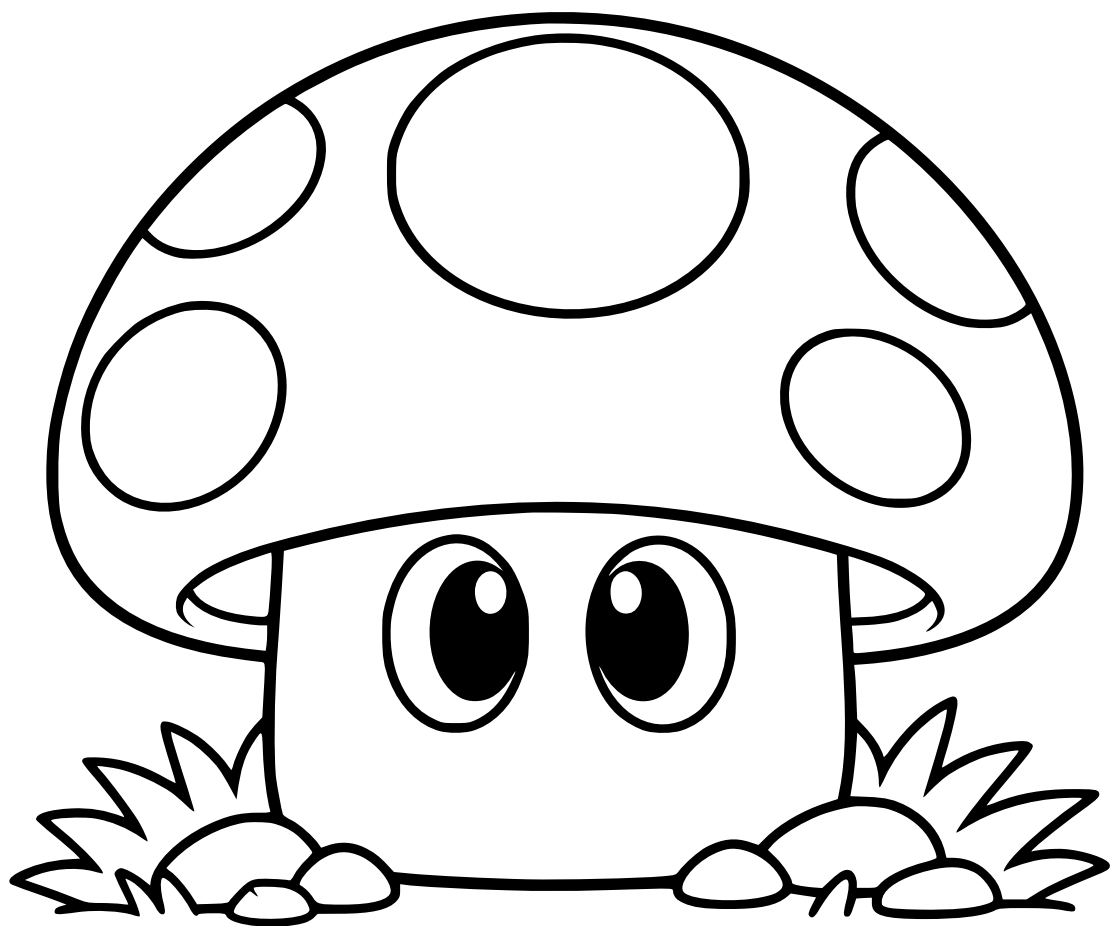


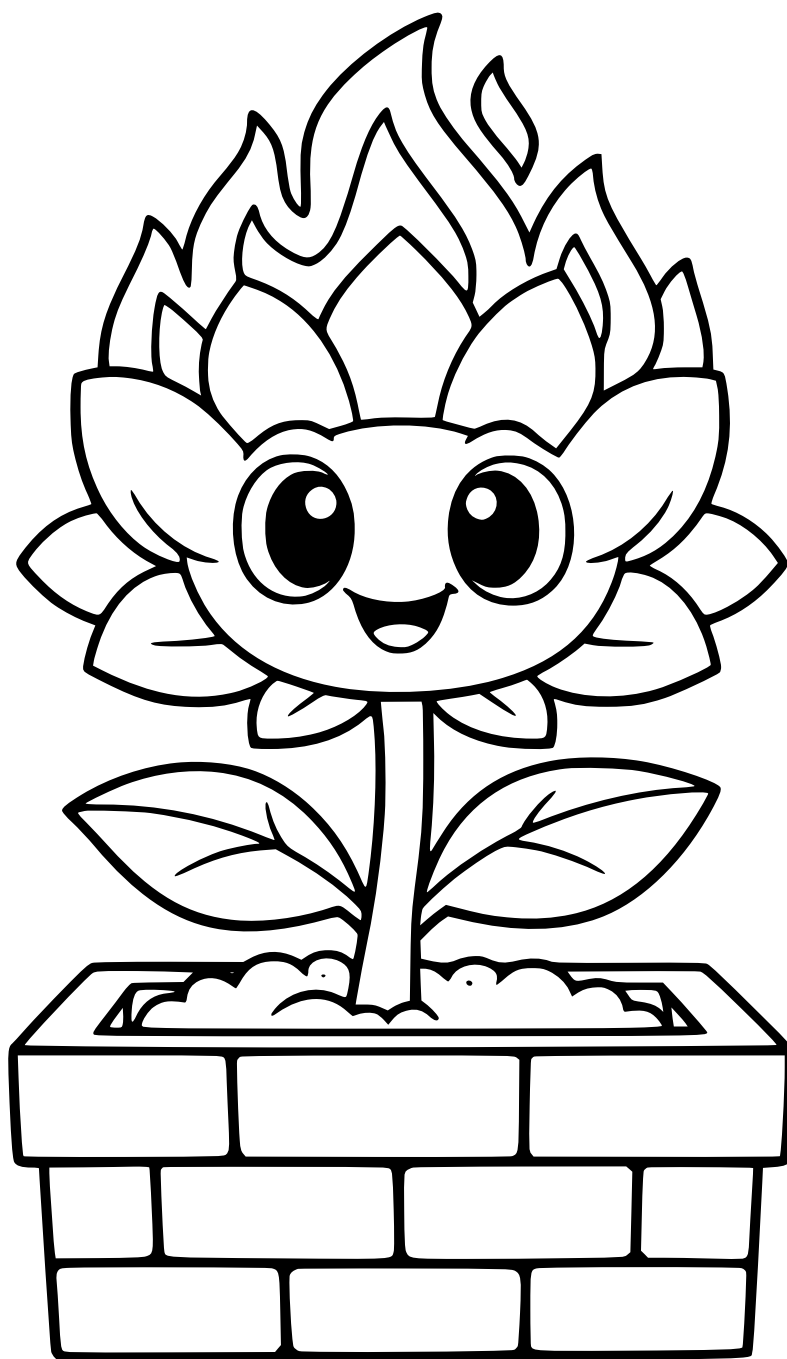


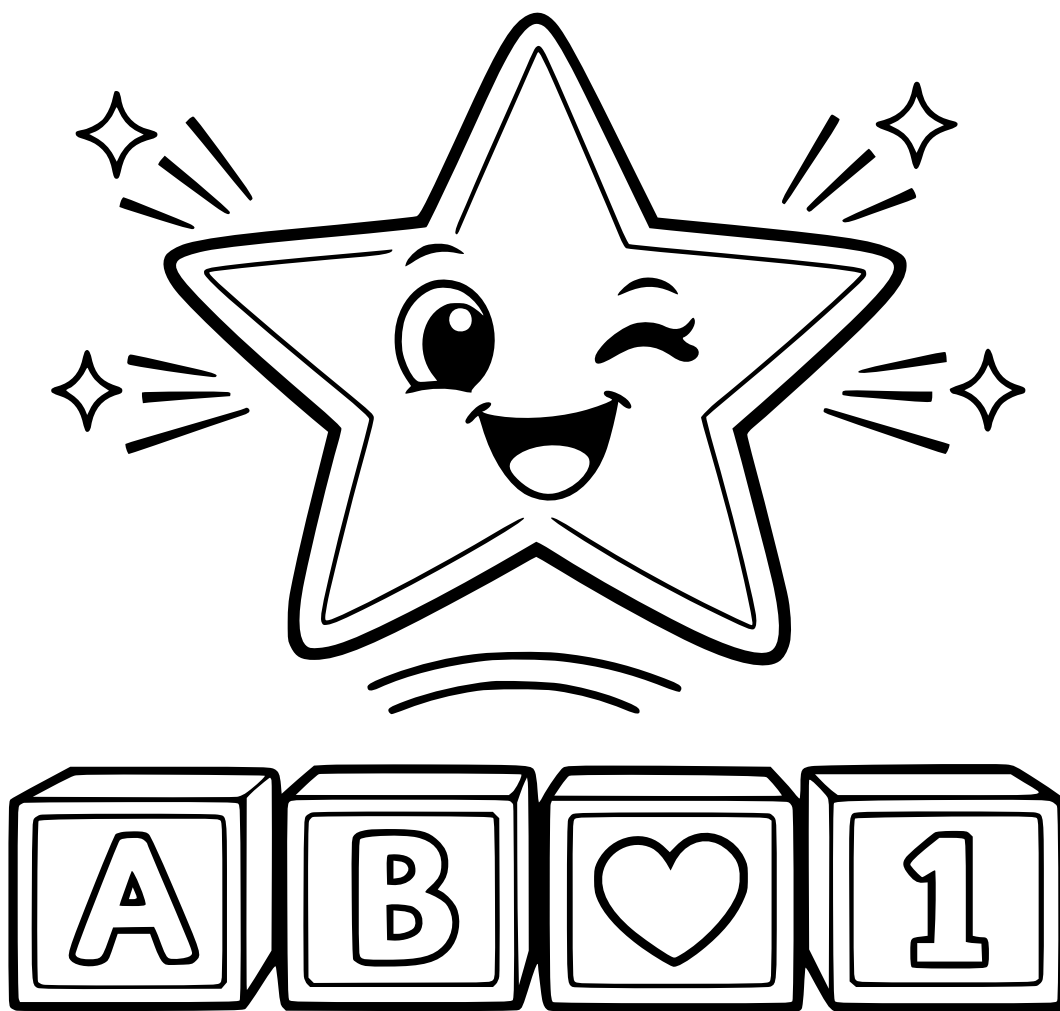


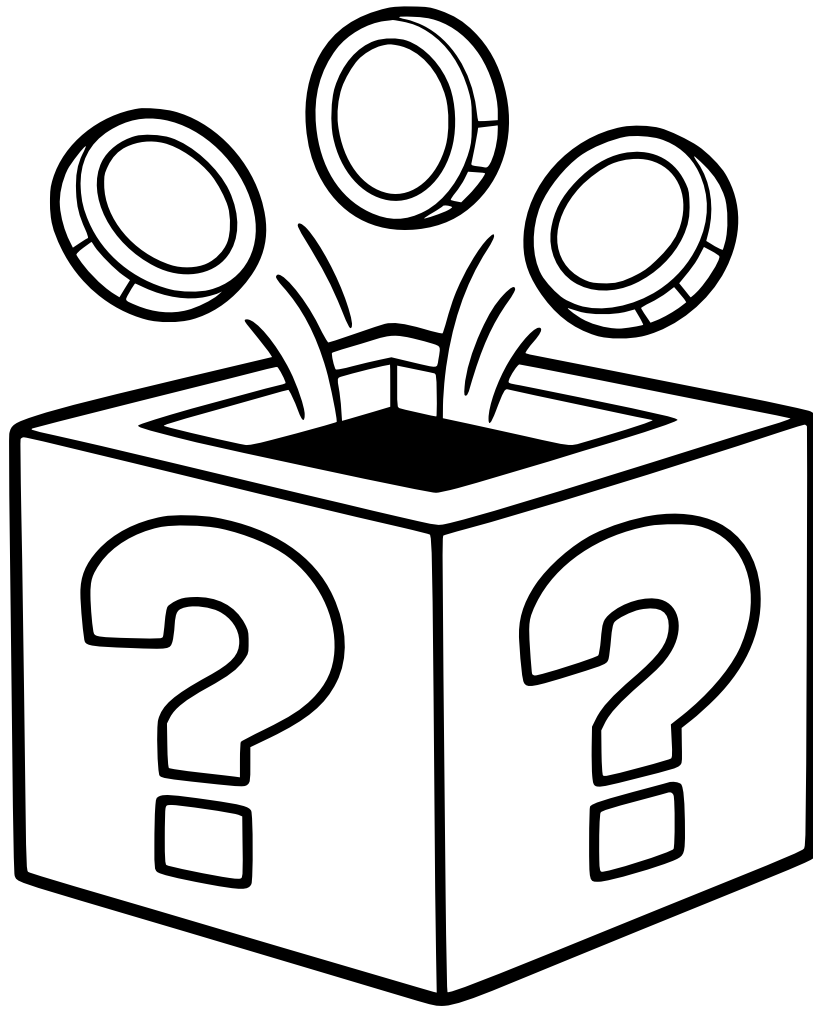


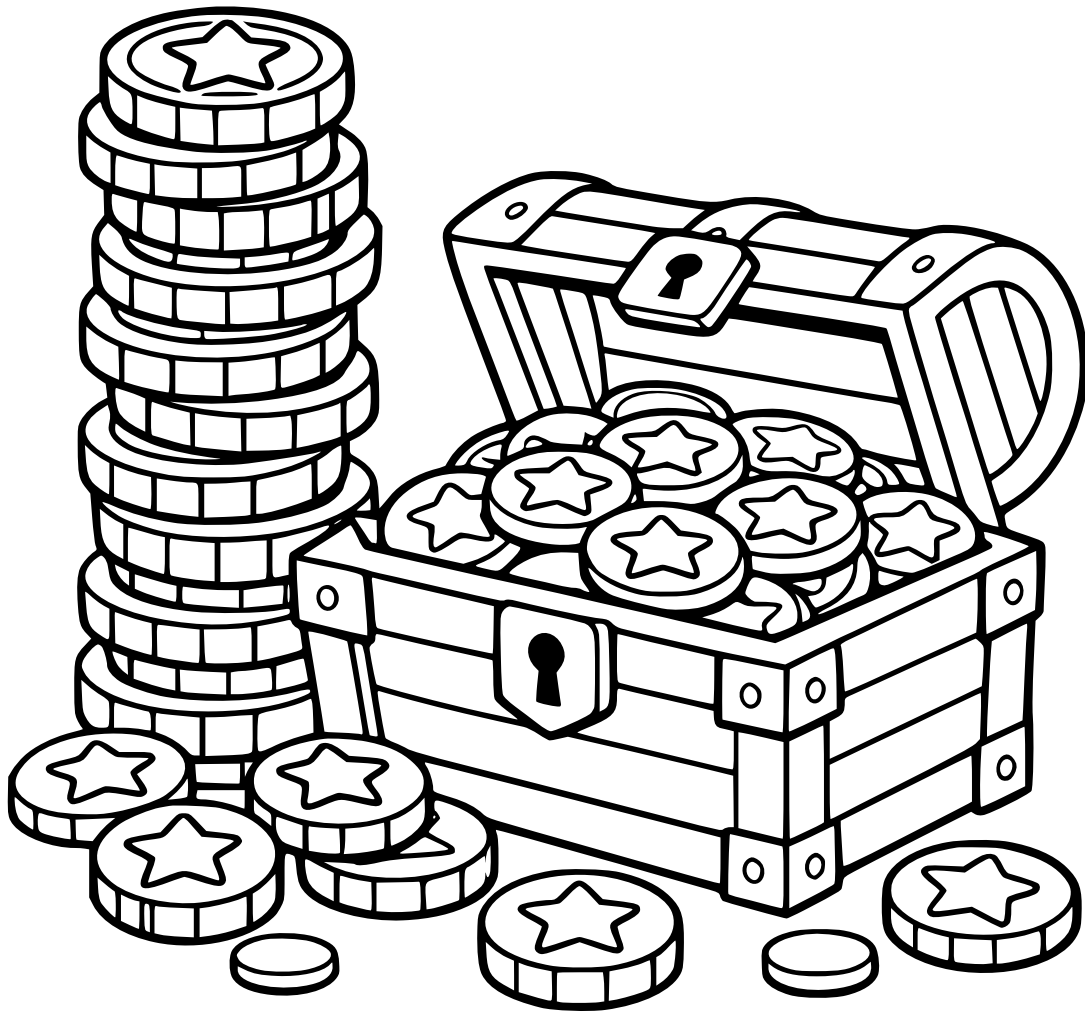


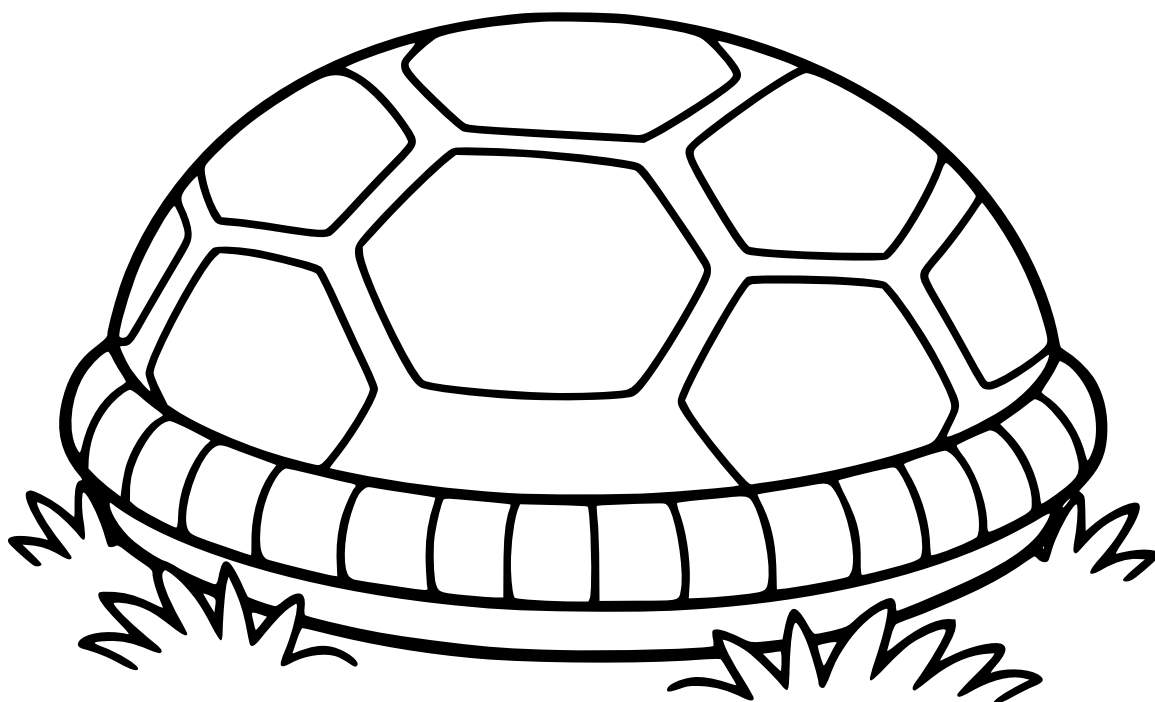


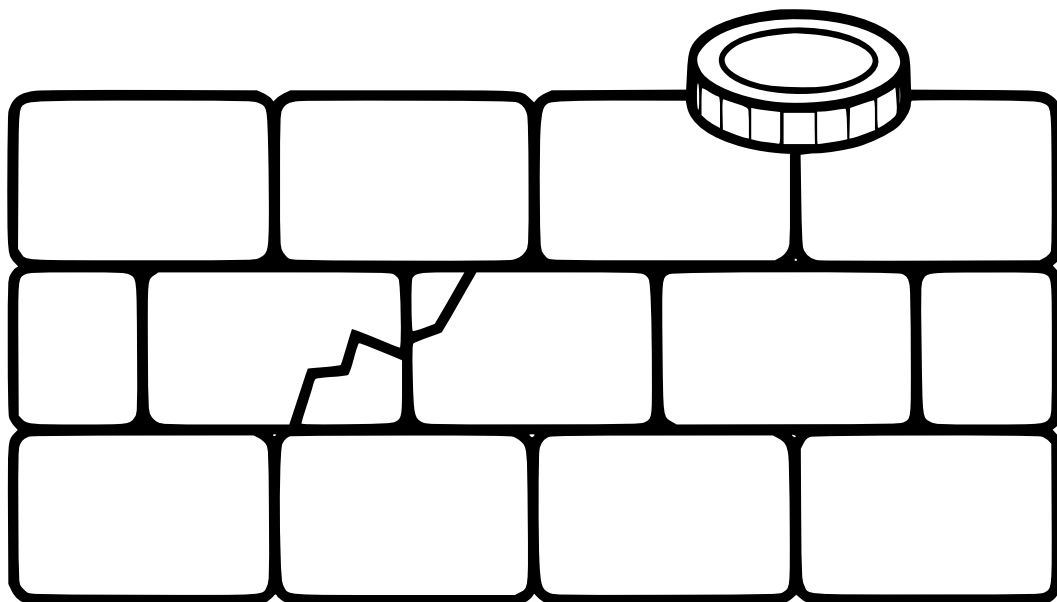


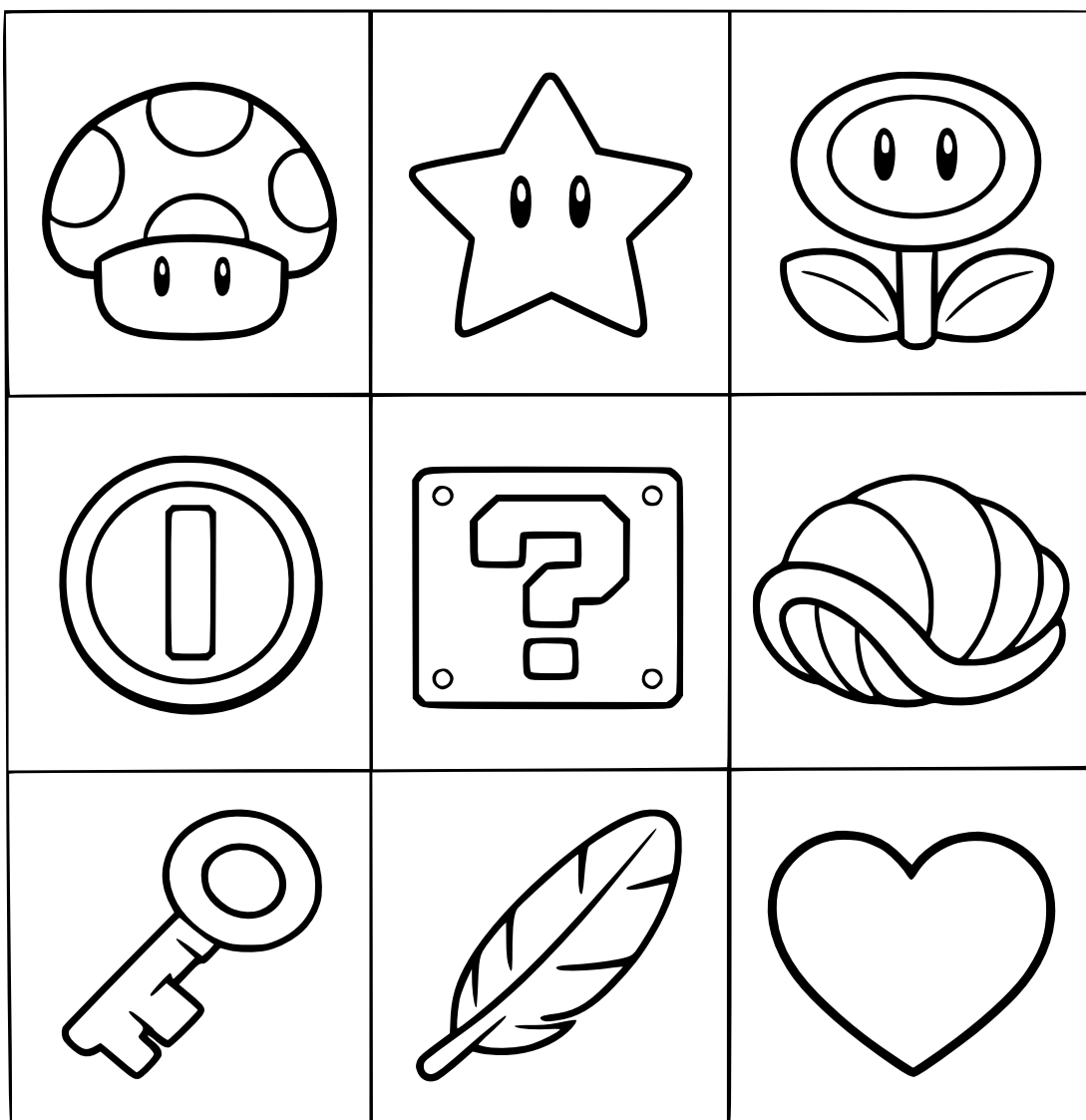


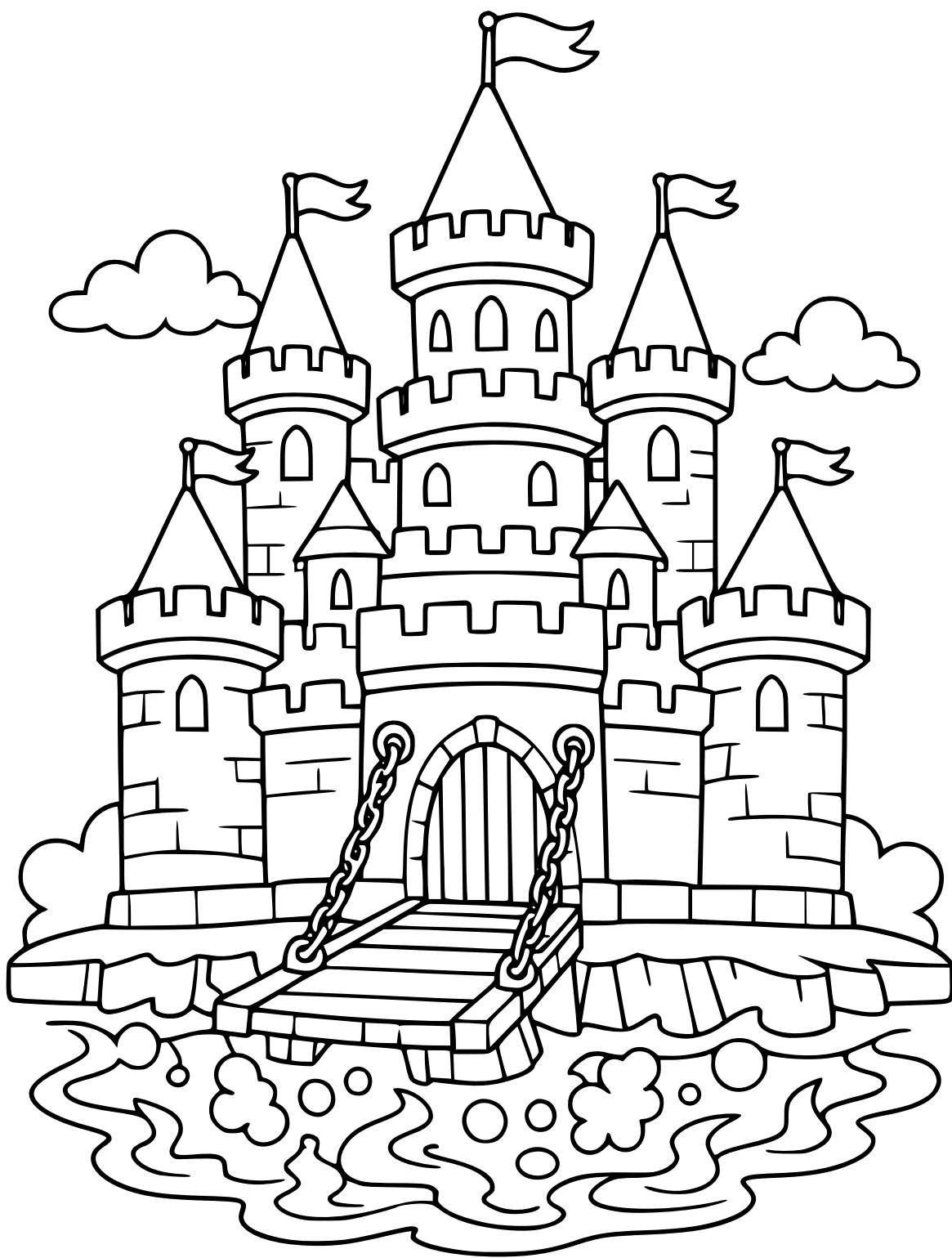


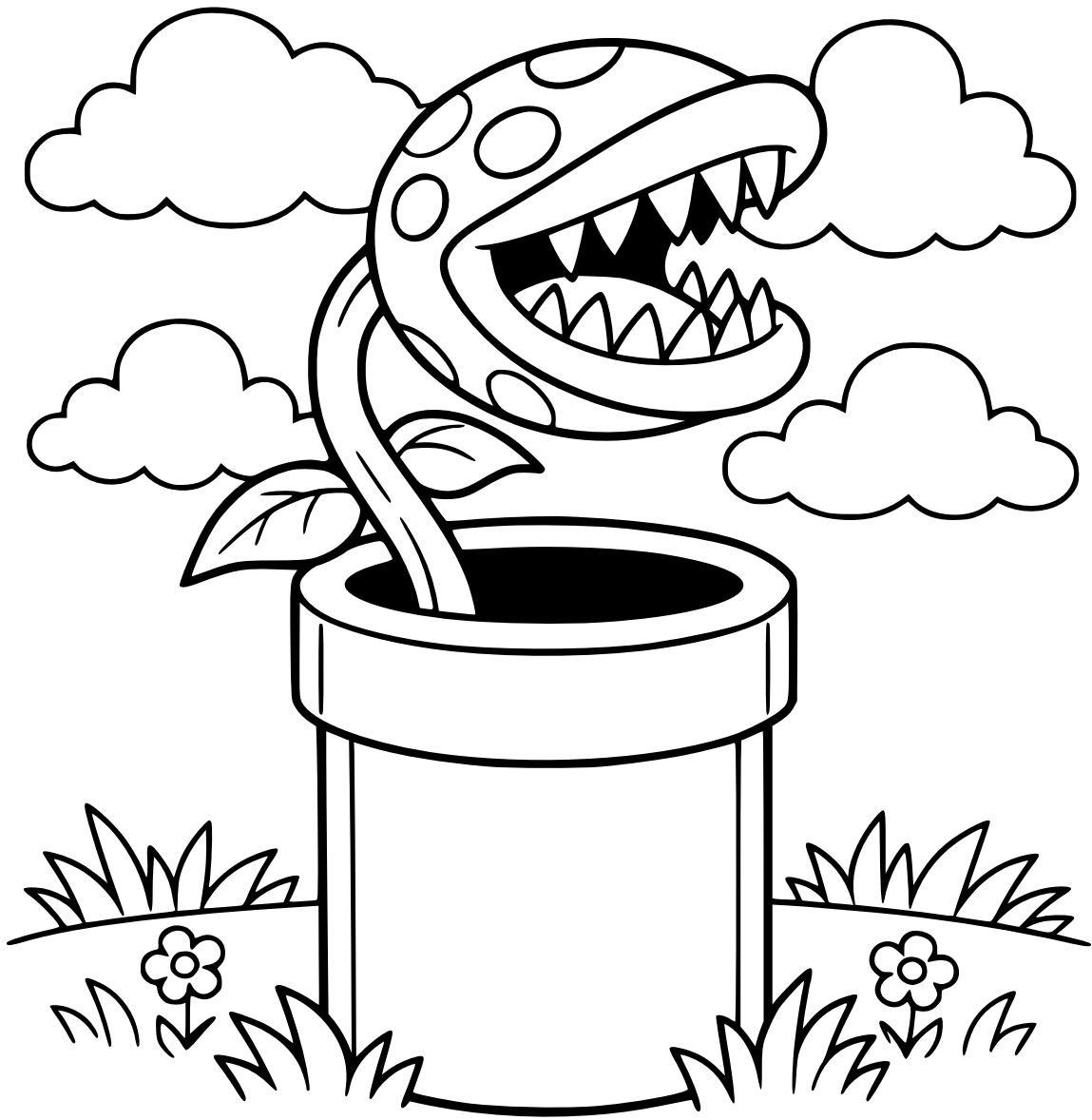


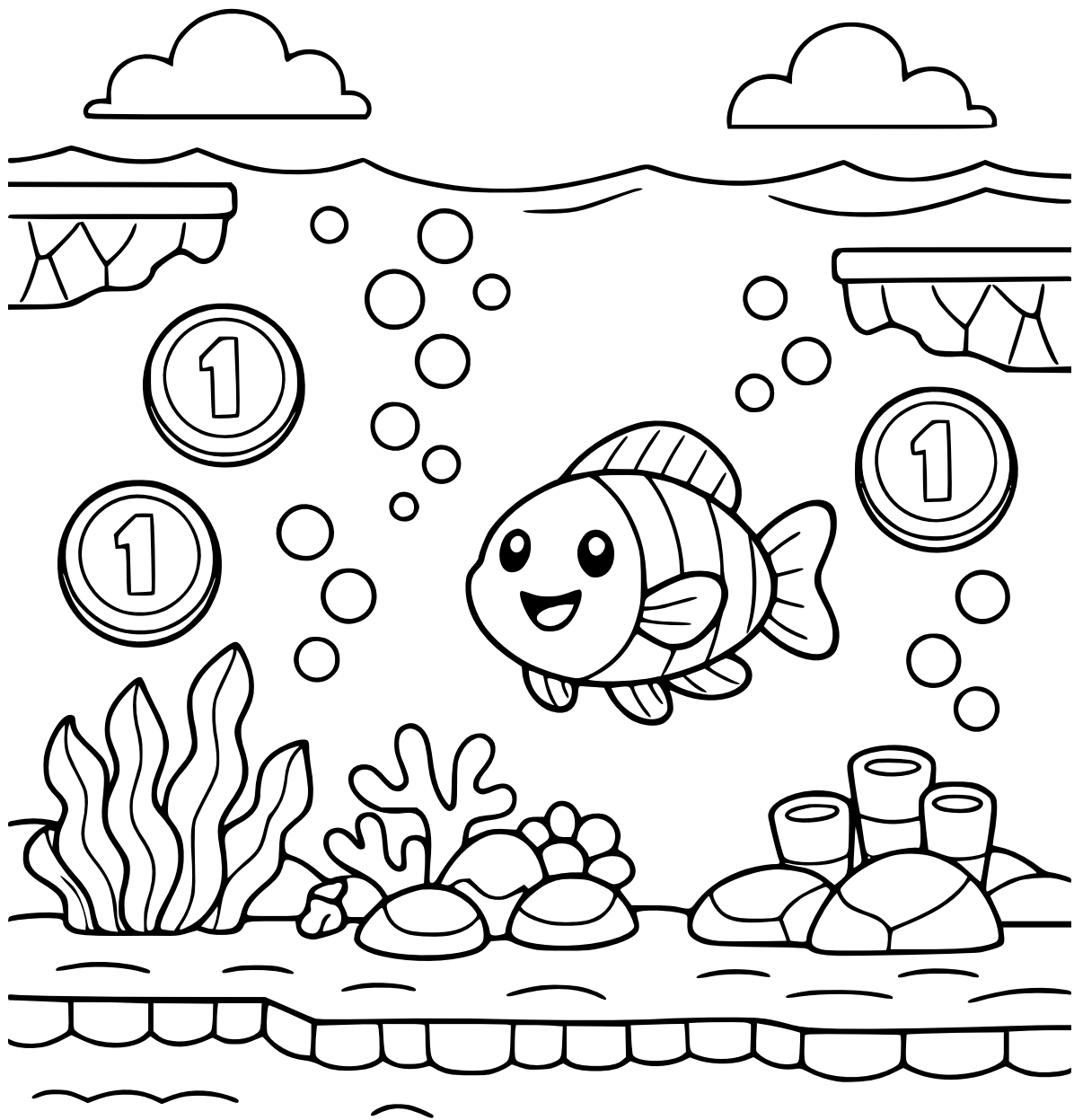




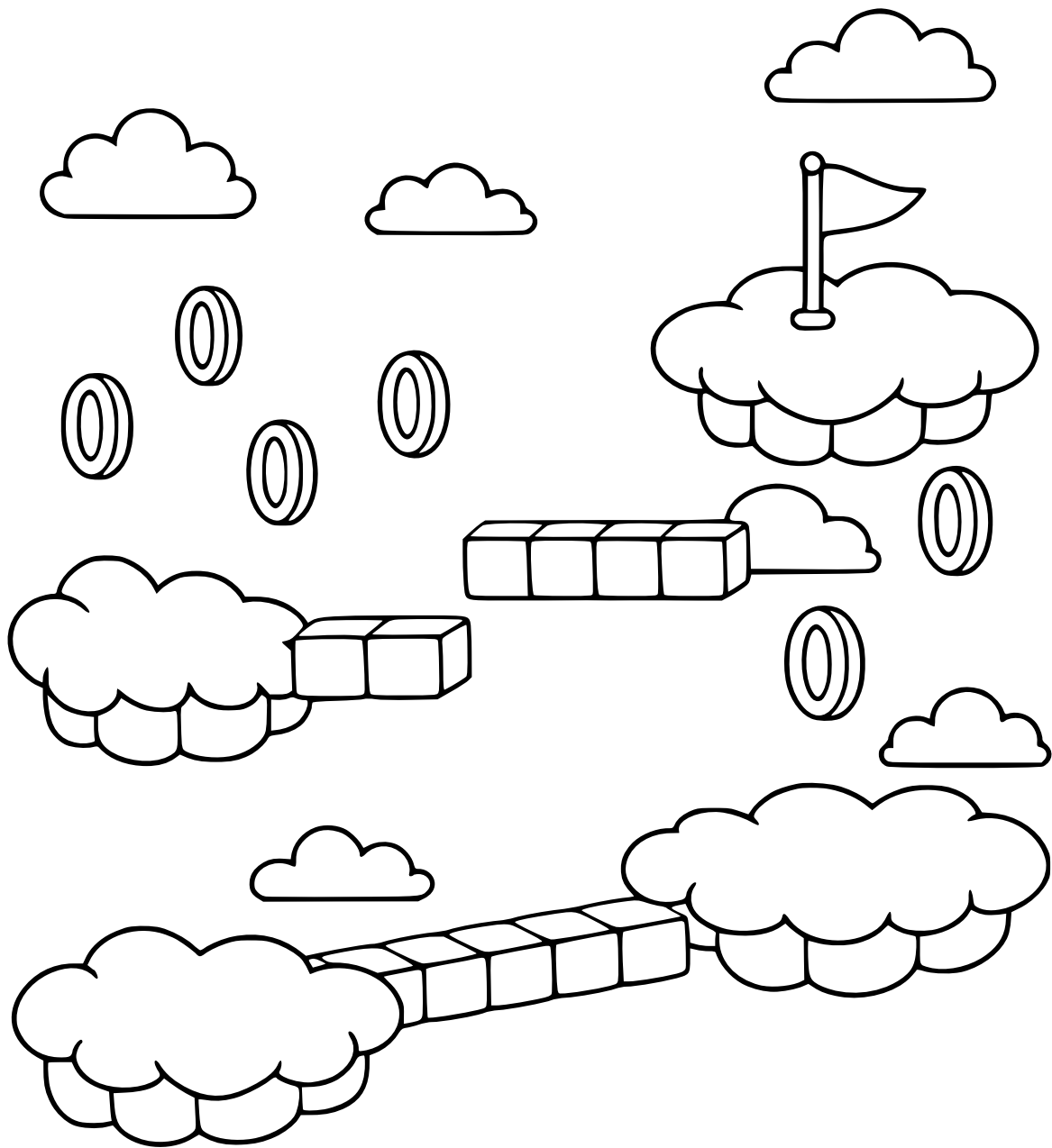




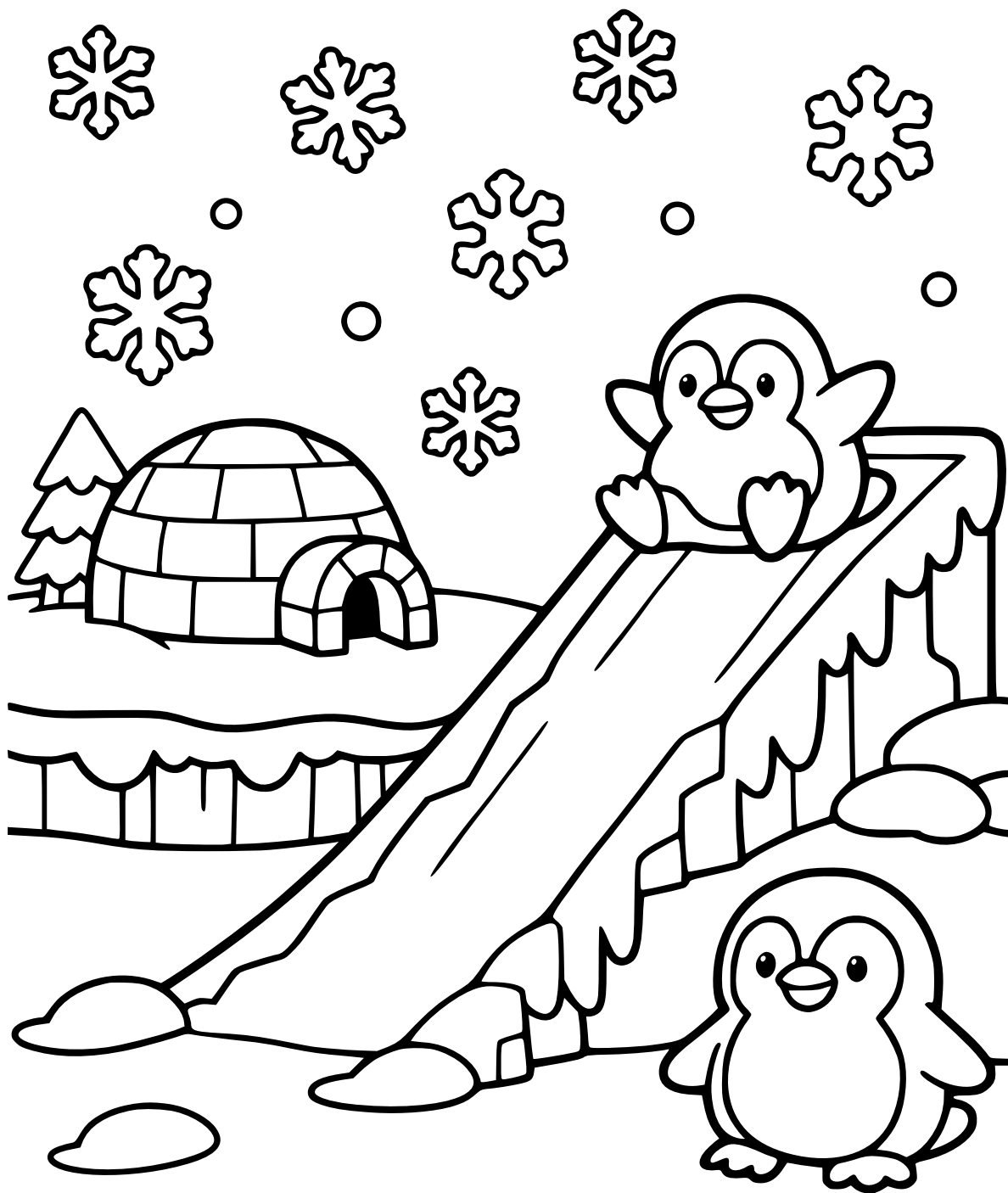








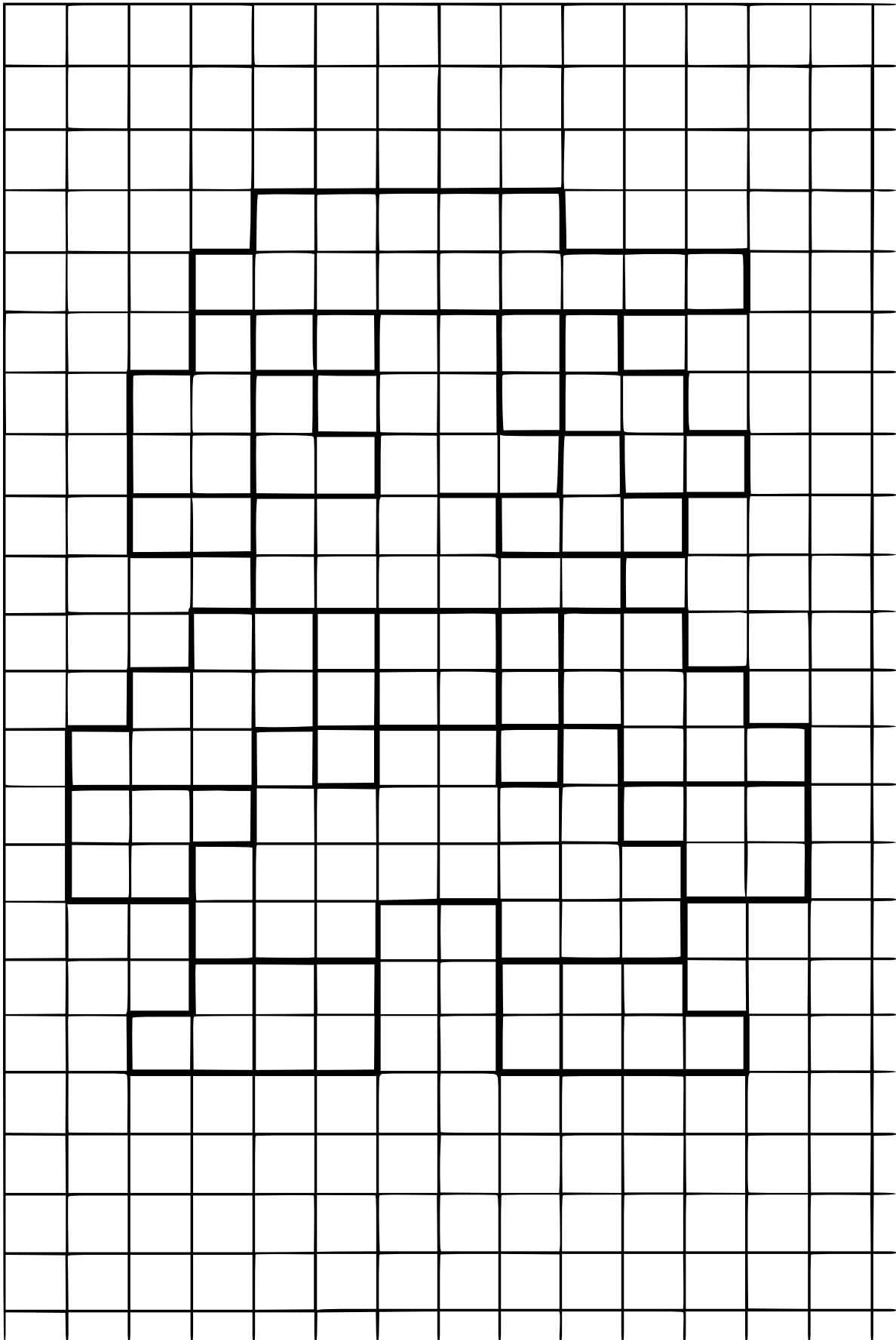


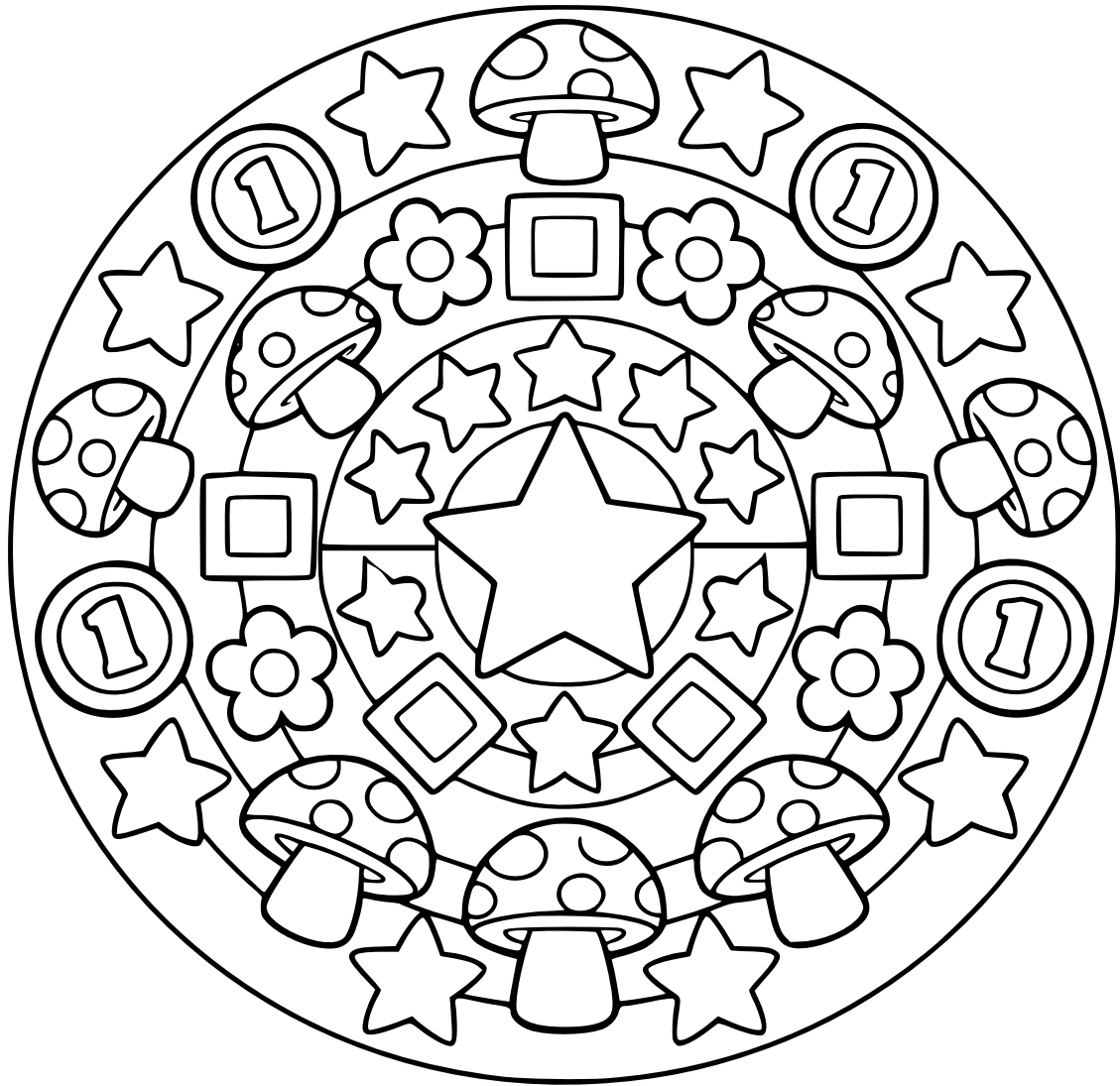


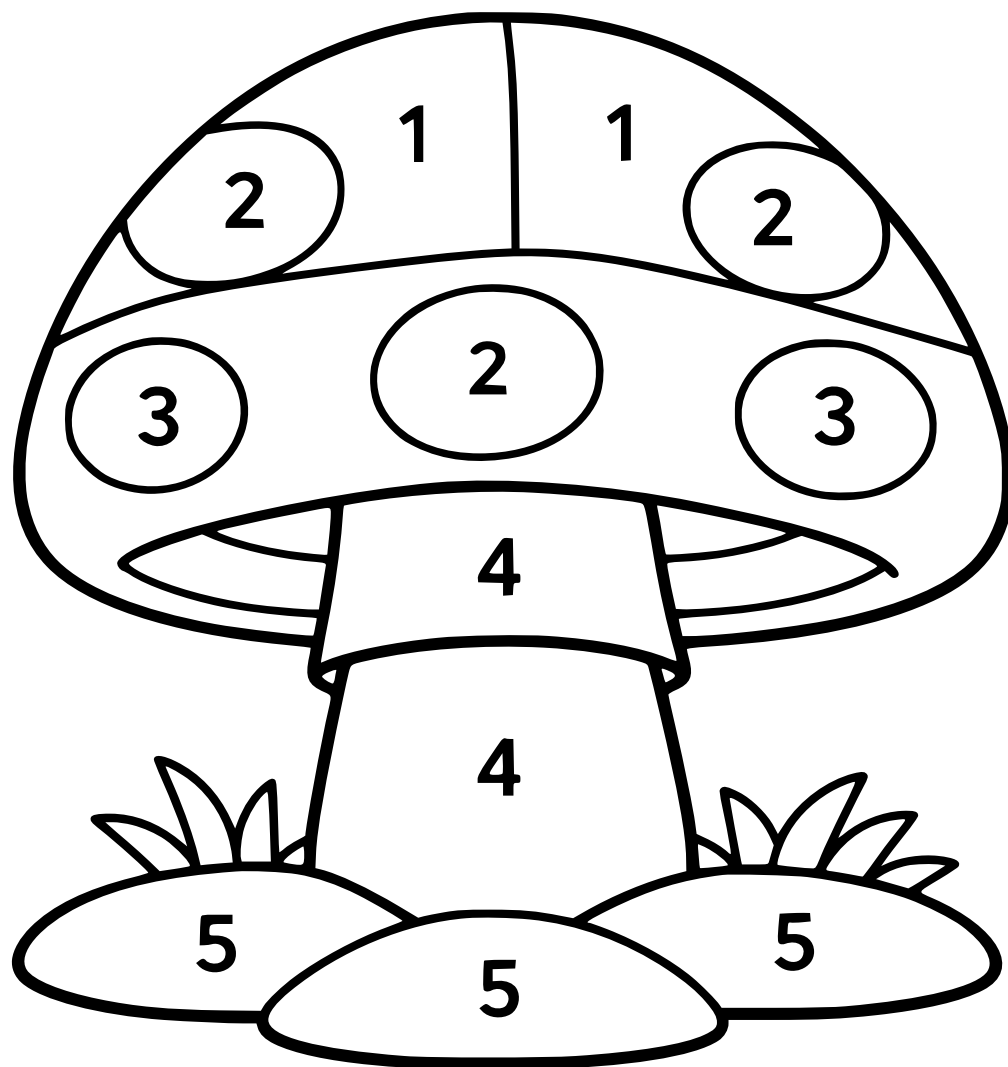


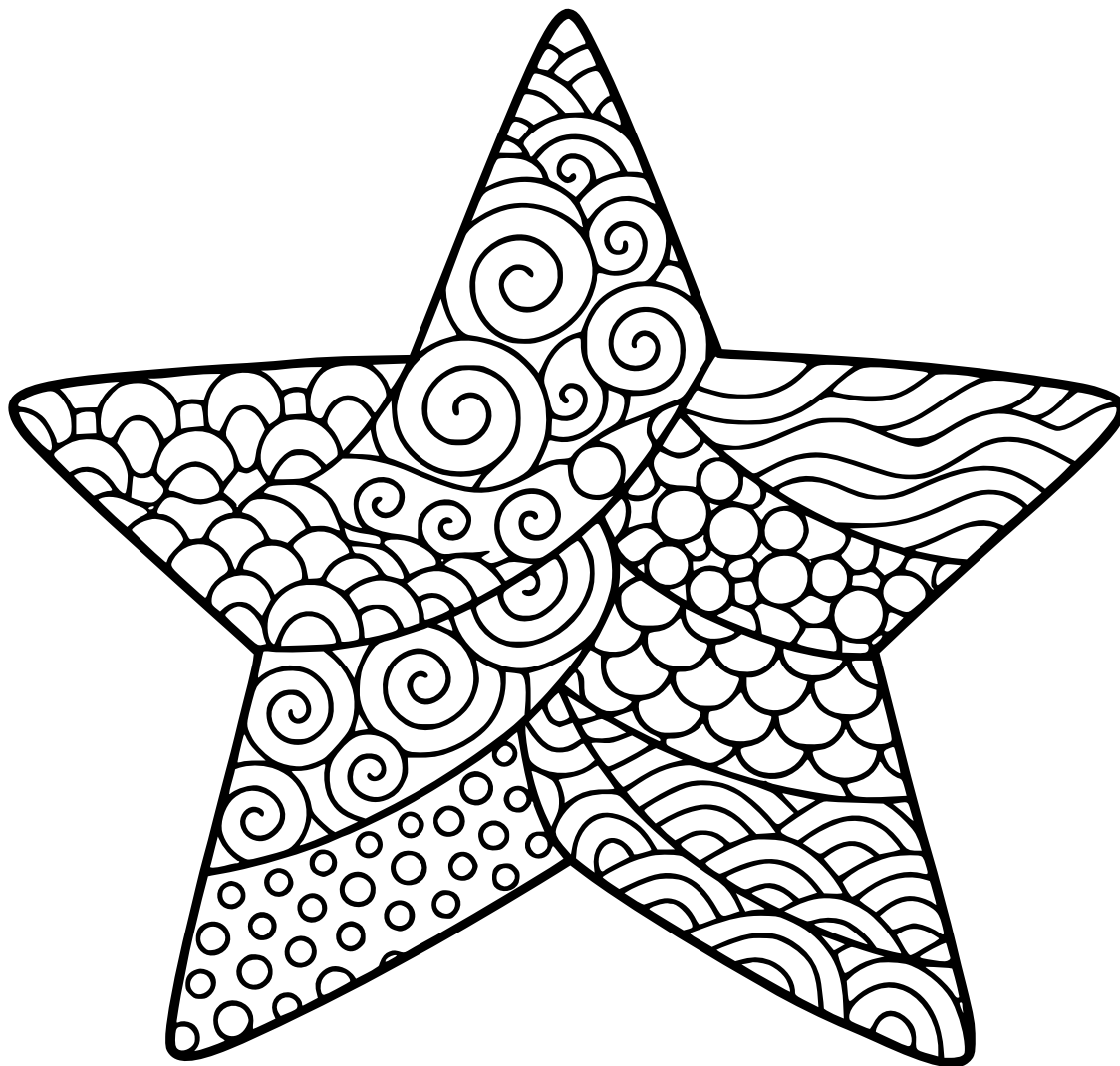
